### Pilots to Act As Volunteer Fire Spotters

WALLA WALLA, June 17 (P)—Airplane pilots on routine flights from the Walla Walla air field will act as voluntary grain fire spotters this summer as one step in a program to reduce fire damage to crops.

The plan was described yesterday at a meeting of civilian defense coordinators and city and county officials.

Washington is the first state to spend any money teaching its farmers how to control grain fires, said L. L. Burgunder, Spokane, chief of rural fire prevention and control in the state civilian defense organization.

### Noted Historian Of Harvard Dies

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., June 17 (P)—Harvard university today mourned the death of one of its foremost educators—Dr. Albert Bushnell Hart, historian, forecaster of world events and authority on George Washington.

The professor emeritus in the science of government died yesterday at the age of 88. Although he retired in 1926 as chairman of the university's department of government, he maintained quarters at Widener library. He had written approximately 250 books, alone and with collaborators.

### WORKER RESCUED FROM SEWER TRAP

CLEVELAND, June 17 (P)—Trapped 65 feet underground in a sewer for more than 13 hours, Gordon Tempamy, 54-year-old construction foreman, was rescued today by desperately-tolling city firemen.

Suffering no ill effects from his entombment, the foreman jokingly told rescuers, "I had a good time." As he emerged from the sewer, his wife rushed to embrace him.

Tempamy is employed by a construction company engaged in building a sewer at E. 37th street and Kingsbury Run. He dashed into a watertight concrete compartment last night to escape drowning as water rushed into the construction project.

Fourteen other men employed on the project fled to nearest exits while Tempamy took refuge in the compartment, about 800 feet from the closest exit. For ten hours he kept in touch with rescuers by telephone, then the communications circuit went dead.
