## DR. SUTCLIFFE TO SPEAK AT BIBLE BAPTIST

Dr. B. B. Sutcliffe, widely known Bible teacher and conference speaker, will occupy the pulpit at the Bible Baptist church, Ward street at South Sixth, Sunday morning at 10 a. m., and each evening through Friday, July 4-9, at 8 p. m.

Dr. Sutcliffe for a number of years was associated with the Moody Bible Institute of Chicago, later coming to the west coast, and for many years was pastor of the First Presbyterian church of Tacoma, Wash., of which he is honored as pastor emeritus.

In 1936, the Multnomah school of the Bible was organized, and for the first seven years Dr. Sutcliffe has been its beloved president, and this year he takes office as chairman of the board of trustees.

Sutcliffe's general subject for the meetings at the Bible Baptist church will be "Scriptural Christianity." The following schedule of studies for the week are:
