Swift Swede Promises to Be Speedier

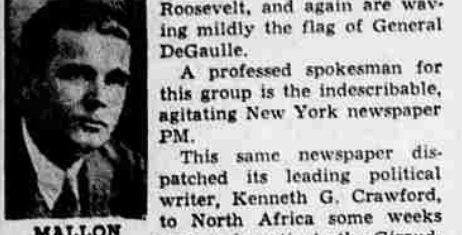
