Dr. Barker gained fame for his work assisting in stamping out bubonic plague in the Philippines in 1899 and in San Francisco in 1901.

Mailing dates for shipping of packages to soldiers are from September 15 to October 15, inclusive. Packages for navy, marine or coast guard men overseas are acceptable up to November 1. And not more than

SUMMER SCHOOL AT OREGON ON JULY 21

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene — Registration for the second session of summer school at the University of Oregon will take place July 21 and classes will commence July 22 and continue for five and one-half weeks, or until August 27.

Many students, particularly pre-medics and education majors who were in attendance first session and who stay on for the second session, will be able to complete one full quarter's work this summer.

For those students entering at the beginning of the second session, there is a choice of courses in economics, education, English, history, mathematics, physical education, and psychology. Persons contemplating teaching after an absence of several years will have an opportunity to brush-up before the opening of school in the fall.

Such sales were suspended between June 30, when the old congressional authority for the sales expired, and yesterday when President Roosevelt signed the new agriculture department supply bill giving new authority.

one package per week will be accepted for the same addressee sent by or on behalf of the same sender.

Articles prohibited for shipment overseas to servicemen include intoxicants and inflammable articles, matches or any inflammable liquids. Men in the armed services are amply provided with food and clothing, so shipping space should not be wasted in sending these, officials said.

Christmas parcels should be endorsed as such on the package. They shouldn't exceed 5 pounds in weight and 15 inches in length, or 36 inches in combined length and girth.

Parcels should be packed in metal, wood, or strong fiber board containers, or in double-faced corrugated fiber board boxes.

Boxes should be securely wrapped in strong paper, and tied with twine. Candy packed in thin boxes should be inclosed in corrugated, wood, or metal boxes.

quired for certification, Oregon history and Oregon school law, will be taught.

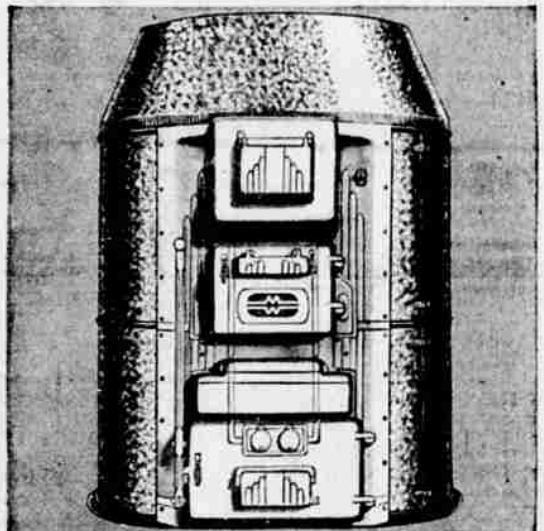

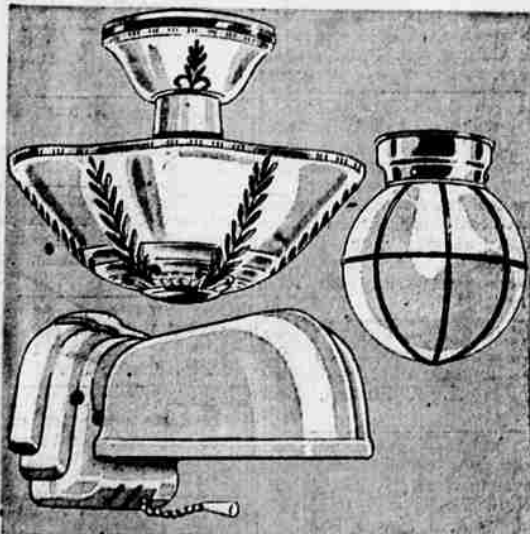

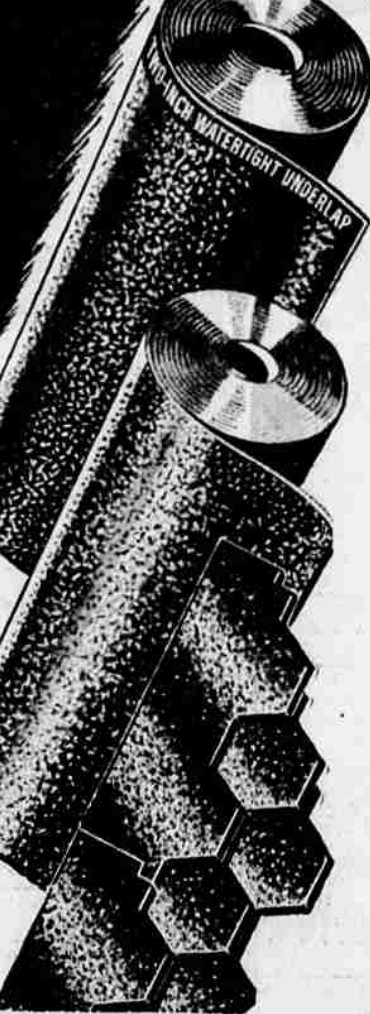
