"Baby" Aircraft Carrier Shepherds Atlantic Convoy

WASHINGTON, July 16 (AP)—In a series of anti-submarine battles in the North Atlantic, the planes of a single baby aircraft carrier recently successfully attacked ten German submarines.

The story of the gallant little flat top, officially designated only as "carrier B," was told by the navy today in a detailed account of how these auxiliary floating air fields are helping to clinch victory for the United States.
