The Women's Army corps will hereafter receive the full time attention of Lieutenant Betty Herring of the WACs who has been assigned to recruiting duty in Klamath Falls. She has established headquarters in the ladies' parlor of the American Legion auxiliary in the Veterans' Memorial hall at Fourth and Main streets.

The new and permanent WAC recruiting officer is a former resident of Portland, Ore., and is a graduate of the officers training school at Fort Des Moines, Ia. Before being assigned to duty at the local sub-station, Lieutenant Herring was stationed at the 5th WAC training center in Ruston, La. She attended the National College of Education in Evanston, Ill., and was a member of the advertising staff of the Oregon Journal in Portland.

Confirming the report that women from 20 to 50 years of age are now eligible for enlistment, the lieutenant explained that she is authorized to accept applications from women in that age group. She also reminded that because the WACs now enjoy full army status, all of its members are eligible for the many benefits offered male members of the armed forces.
