

LSW-AFL WINS RUN-OFF VOTE IN LAKEVIEW

The Lumber and Sawmill Workers, AFL, was designated as bargaining agency in a run-off election at the Underwood Lumber company, Lakeview, on Wednesday, July 21, according to Don Gilman, brotherhood representative for the Lakeview area. The results of the balloting: AFL 84, CIO 21.

Gilman also reported that a petition for an election and certification of bargaining rights has been filed for the Willow Ranch, Calif., operation of the Crane Creek Lumber company. That August 11 has been tentatively set as the election date. A petition for an election at the Lakeview Lumber company has also been filed.

Brotherhood Representative L. G. Carroll reports that a petition has been filed with the NLRB for an election and certification of bargaining rights for both mills of the Ralph L. Smith company at Canby, Calif. A contract has recently been signed with the Dorris Lumber and Moulding company of Dorris, Calif.

DISPLAYS CELEBRATE OLD OREGON TRAIL

Many historic articles have already been submitted to be displayed in various store windows here, when Klamath Falls joins other Oregon cities in celebrating the Old Oregon Trail centennial the week of August 15.

Among interesting old relics to be shown is a set of pigeon holes which constituted the first Linkville postoffice, a green porringer four generations old, a brass bucket which came over the old Utah trail, saddles, branding irons, a hand-made bit, guns of various sizes and patterns, and old music boxes which still play.

The centennial committee is anxious to have anyone owning articles with a pioneer interest to communicate with them and make arrangements to loan the things for centennial week. Anything of interest is acceptable, such as old hand-made quilts, fancy work, garments, kitchen utensils, glass and china, saddles, guns, bridles, branding irons and pictures of early days or of pioneers. Indian articles are not wanted at this time. It is hoped, however, to have another exhibit within a short time consisting of Indian relics.

Cadets raised \$25, paid for an operation to remove cataracts, and Raider celebrated his second birthday yesterday with a very satisfactory sightseeing tour.

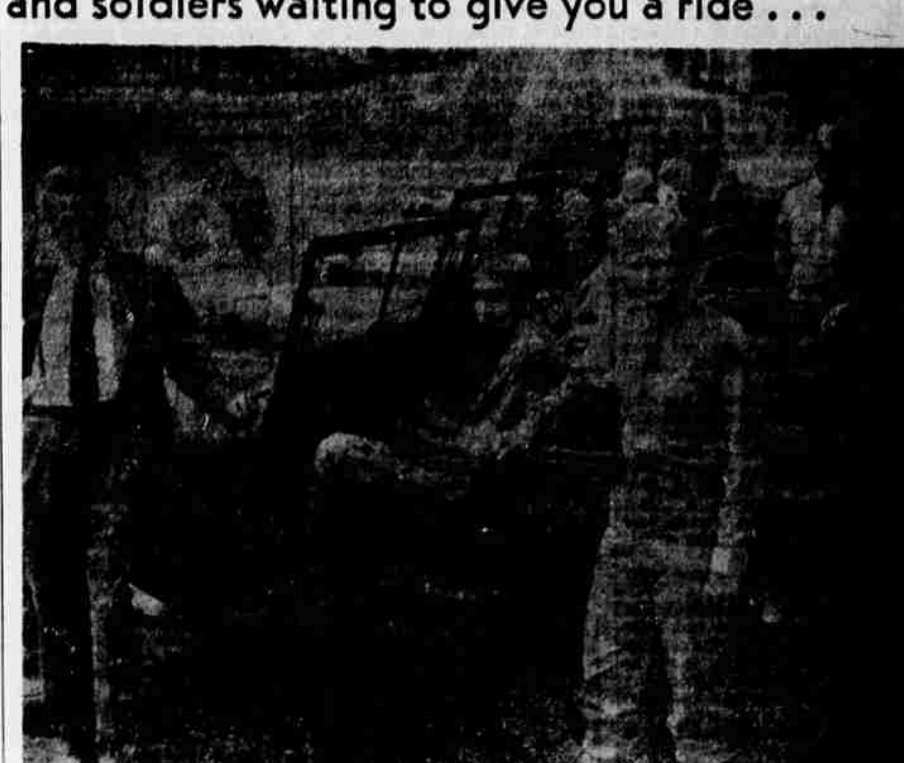

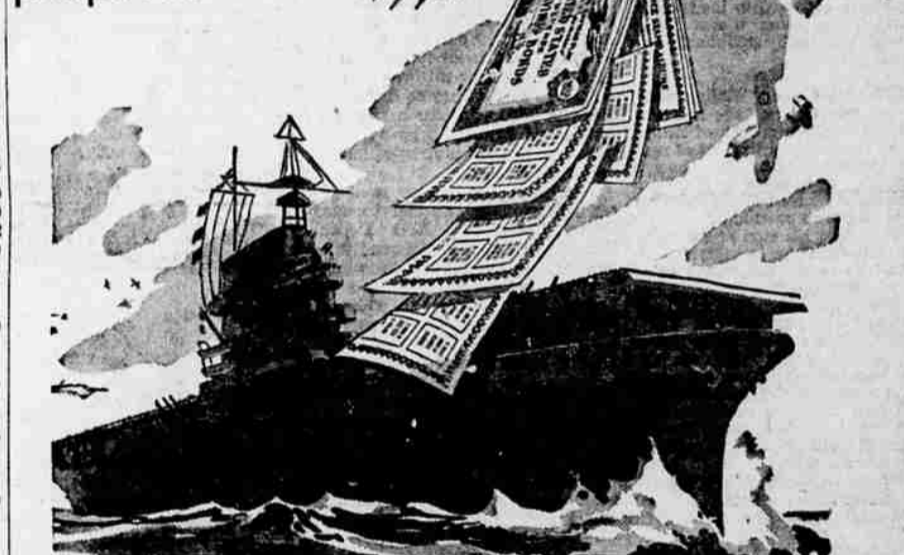
