Klamath Sales Drop During June

Sales figures in Klamath Falls showed a 9 per cent drop during the month of June, according to a United States census bureau report. Klamath Falls was the only town in the state to show a sales decrease, Oregon's independent retailers as a whole increasing sales by 23 per cent in June.

Oregon's shoe stores, their sales apparently increased instead of decreased by rationing, showed an 89 per cent increase in June over last year, the bureau said.

Sales of women's clothes jumped 64 per cent; jewelry stores, 74 per cent. Most spectacular gain was Portland's shoe stores—136 per cent. Retail trade rose 35 per cent in Eugene, 33 per cent in Portland, and 15 per cent in Salem.
