Keep Postwar Fleet Intact, Says Vinson
MILLEDGEVILLE, Ga., Aug. 12 (AP)—Rep. Carl Vinson (D-Ga.), chairman of the house naval affairs committee, suggested Wednesday that the American fleet be kept intact after the war as a guarantee of world peace.
Predicting that "wars, and rumors of wars," would continue in the future, the veteran Georgia congressman said in an interview it would be his earnest wish that the United States refrain from any post-war commitments which would result in scrapping of which ordinary steel would break.

OUT-STEELS STEELS
By adding three parts of the little-used element columbium to 97 parts of iron, metallurgists have developed an alloy tougher than steel. It has withstood tests at 1100 degrees Fahrenheit, a temperature at which ordinary steel would break.

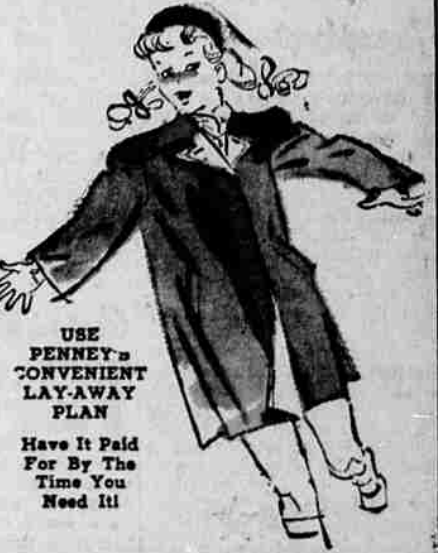

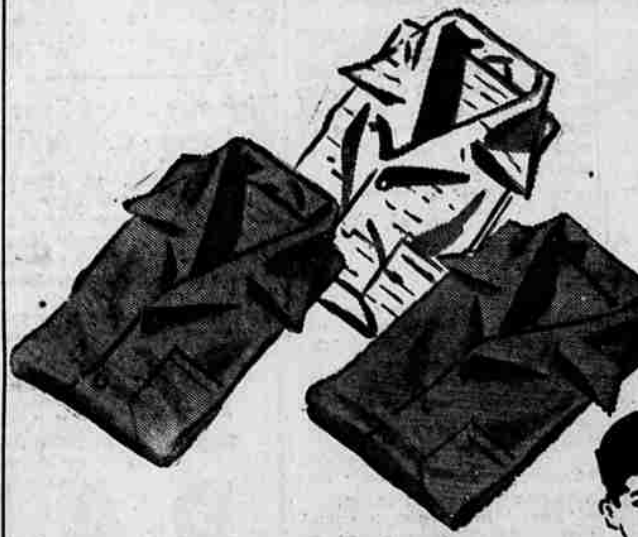
