

COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM READY FOR OPENING

With only a little over two weeks left to go, preparations for the opening of county schools are nearing completion. An approximate registration

of between 4500 and 5000 rural students are expected this year, according to county school officials. This is a little less than last year's. School principals for suburban localities have all been selected, though a complete teacher list is not yet available. Janitors have been working all summer at most of the schools doing any repair work necessary, and painting, polishing and waxing floors.

Almost three tons of new elementary school books which have been adopted this year by the state text book commission are being stamped and numbered in the county school offices for distribution at the beginning of school.

Not many school changes have been made for the new year. Summers school, which was closed during the middle of last year to accommodate CPT training here, will not reopen this year.

Germans Prepare Defenses in Balkans

ANKARA, Aug. 12 (Delayed) (AP)—Information from the Balkans today reported the Germans were throwing up defense fortifications on the north banks of the Sava river in Yugoslavia which joins the Danube north of Belgrade.

It was believed the Germans were preparing secondary defense lines through the Balkans, should they be forced to fall back due to Italy's capitulation or an allied invasion of the Balkans. The Sava river, the Danube and the Carpathian mountains form a natural defense line for the northern Balkans.

GROCERYMAN LETS OPA INSPECT STORE

Refusal to let OPA representatives inspect his store was finally withdrawn by Gust Lampropoulos, grocery store proprietor, but only after an order from the U. S. marshal, requiring him to appear in federal court and show cause for his action, had been served. Previously Lampropoulos had

been given an inspection requirement signed by Prentiss M. Brown, OPA director, after it was learned he refused OPA inspectors the right to examine his store. When he still refused, the marshal served his papers, and Lampropoulos and his attorney appeared at the OPA office, where the matter was settled.
