

## DAUGHTERS IN WACS COULD STOP DRAFT

If every qualified daughter in each community throughout the nation would enlist to serve with the women's army corps, the necessity for drafting fathers might be postponed indefinitely. This was pointed out today by Lt. Betty Herring, WAC recruiter stationed here, who added that the most effective way to relieve the country's manpower shortage is to increase its womanpower.

Since the need is so critical at this time, Lt. Herring urged that every eligible woman who even vaguely has considered joining the women's army corps do so now rather than postpone it into the indefinite future.

Two-thirds of the specialist jobs in the army which have formerly required the services of men are now open to WAC personnel, according to a recent announcement. Women are filling these positions as rapidly as they can be enlisted and trained, thus releasing men for active combat duty. With over 400 different types of specialist jobs to choose from, there is almost unlimited opportunity for qualified women who wish to do all in their power to help bring the war to an early and victorious end.

Lt. Herring invited any interested woman between the ages of 20 and 50 to visit the WAC headquarters in the Memorial building at Fourth and Main streets where she will be glad to provide them with all information desired. The telephone number is 7383.

## American Localism Sound World Hope, Says Chamber Head

LONDON, Aug. 18 (P)—American localism—that idea of home town boosting—holds the germ of a soundly-based world hope, Eric A. Johnston, president of the United States chamber of commerce, told members of the British chambers of commerce today.

"I make no apology for our American localism," Johnston said in a luncheon address. "I take pride and comfort in it, for it holds the germ of a soundly-based world hope. It is close to the lives of men and women. I think we have talked too much of peoples in the mass and not enough about the people who make the locality. You will never get a good world except through good localities, you will never get good localities except through good people, and you will never get peace except through a good world."

## Bodies Recovered From Plane Crash

PENDLETON, Ore., Aug. 18 (P)—The Pendleton army air base announced last night that the bodies of the four men killed in the crash of a B-17 Flying Fortress had been recovered in the Blue mountains near Tollgate.

Officials said only four men were aboard the plane, which crashed Monday on a routine flight, and apparently none had a chance to use parachutes.

None was from the Pacific northwest.

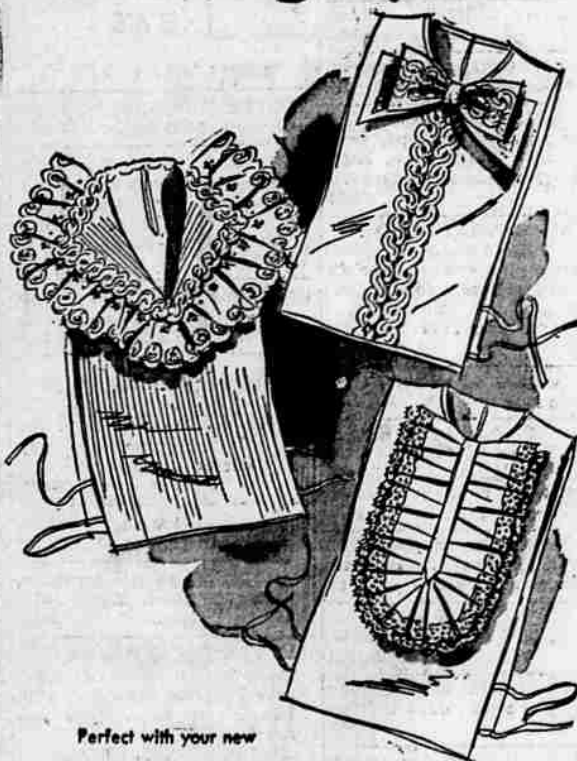

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (P)—Uniform grading and scaling rules have been drawn up for

logs produced in Oregon and Washington west of the Cascade mountain crest, the office of price administration (OPA) announced today.

Scaling rules are used to esti-

mate the contents of logs in terms of quantity of lumber which can be produced from them and grading rules are used to determine the quality of a given log, OPA explained.

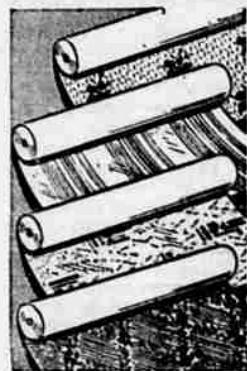

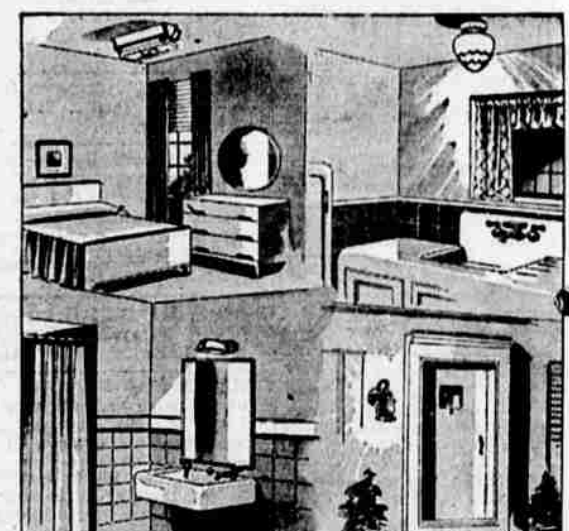
