

WARING FLAYS WAR STRIKERS, JOHN L. LEWIS

BAKER, Ore., Aug. 19 (AP)—Complete destruction not only of the leaders of Germany, Japan and Italy but the ideologies and organizations of their peoples was advocated here this morning by Roane Waring of Memphis, Tenn., national commander of the American Legion, in the keynote address before the 25th annual convention of the Oregon department, American Legion.

"Those leaders could not have done what they did had they not had the backing of their peoples," said Waring. "Let's not get sentimental and softhearted. This war must be dictated in Rome just as it is dictated in Tokyo and Berlin. If we need Italy to march through we can march through her as a hostile country. We don't have to take them into our hearts and feed them. Germany fed them. Let her continue to feed them."

Waring denounced John L. Lewis and wartime strikers as traitors to the nation; assailed what he termed "a weak, uncertain and vacillating policy in Washington" dealing with labor and production; praised congress for passing an anti-strike bill; and assailed Vice President Wallace for his reputed statement that the "social revolution is on its way and the devil and all his angels cannot stop it."

Waring said that "despite the devil and his angels the American Legion will stop it."

Ample Storage For Grain Crop Seen

Oregon farmers appear to have no problem in providing storage space for this year's grain crop, according to results of a survey released this week by the state AAA office.

The survey, made by county AAA committees, shows that there is space enough in the seven principal wheat producing counties for almost 16 1/2 million bushels of the 1943 crop. All of this space is in interior warehouses and in farm storage facilities and does not include a considerable amount of space available in terminal elevators.

The situation differs sharply from that of last year, points out R. B. Taylor, state AAA committee chairman. A month before harvesting of the 1942 crop started, only about 10 million bushels of space was in sight in all storage facilities. To solve the problem, growers constructed more than five million bushels of new storage.

Aluminum Plants in West to Continue in Post-War Era

SEATTLE, Aug. 19 (AP)—Present aluminum operations in this state definitely are not "war babies" and will be continued after the war because of the cheap power of Bonneville and Grand Coulee, Charles Carr of Pittsburgh, public relations director for the Aluminum Company of America, told Seattle business and civic leaders in conference here yesterday.

Railroads, the motor car companies and other industries now experimenting with light metals will make a postwar market for the aluminum industry, he said.

PORTLAND, Aug. 19 (AP)—Two high-ranking army officers praised this country's fighting men in interviews last night.

The Yank soldier is better disciplined and trained than in

the last war, said A. J. Gen. John E. Dahlquist, commander of the 70th (Trail Blazer) division at Camp Adair.

Lieut. Col. Chester F. Sharp, chief of the army's water transportation section during the North African invasion, said the American boys "are excellent

fighters—each knows what to do and he does it right."

Machinists Ask All Japs Be Treated As War Prisoners

SEATTLE, Aug. 19 (AP)—Making no distinction between American-born and alien Japanese, the tri-state convention of the International Association of Machinists yesterday passed resolutions urging that all Japanese in relocation centers be treated as prisoners of war.

The delegates, AFL machinists from Washington, Oregon and California, further recommended that "the federal government take steps toward deportation of those Japanese whose removal is recommended by the bureau of investigation."

Oregon was selected for the next convention, the city to be decided later.

Republican Roots For Roosevelt Defeat in 1944

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 19 (AP)—Frederick E. Baker of Seattle, a republican national committeeman, declared yesterday that if the republicans failed to defeat President Roosevelt should he run for a fourth term "we'll have committed our country to a condition it will take years to rectify."

"We have to go into this (the 1944) campaign as one, and not as a disunited group," he added in declaring he thought President Roosevelt could be defeated if he runs in 1944.
