

HIGH SCHOOL KRATER READY FOR FIRST DAY

Klamath Union high school has already come to life, even though the opening date for the school is not until August 30.

The Krater, school newspaper, will be distributed on the first day of school for the benefit of new as well as old students. This is the first time in the history of the school that the paper has been put out the first day. Acting advertising manager for the first issue will be Beverly Zamskey; acting copy editor, Juanita Shinn; acting news editor, Charlene Harmon; temporary rewrite editor, George Long; make-up editors, Steve Stone and Pat Hutchinson; headlines, Jack Proctor, and feature advertising, June Bosworth.

These positions are for the first issue only and permanent places will be earned by staff members later on.

The Krater this year is not a school subject but is being done outside of school time.

There is still room for more students who are interested in journalism and Krater work, and they are invited to come up to the journalism room in the high school any week night after 7 o'clock.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 20 (AP) — President Roosevelt told President Quezon of The Philippines in a birthday message Thursday that he is certain that "in the not too distant future your country and people will be freed from our common enemy."

The greeting was addressed to Quezon at Saranac Lake, N. Y., where he has been recuperating from an illness. Quezon is 65 years old today.

KLAMATH MAN INVOLVED IN CAR ACCIDENT

A car driven by Ross Gilkison, 1420 East Main street of Klamath Falls, was one of two which struck a motorcycle late Saturday night on the Pacific highway near Jackson Hot Springs.

The right front fender of the car, which was traveling north, struck the motorcycle, also going north. Following this, a car driven by William Blackburn of Ashland, struck the motorcycle and went into a ditch. Gilkison said the cycle swerved in front of his car just as he started to pass it.

Dale Emerson Crouse, 17, of Phoenix, who was riding on the cycle, was confined in an Ashland hospital with a fracture of his left leg, and head, hip and arm abrasions suffered in the accident. The driver of the motorcycle, Verlyn DuBois Thomas, also 17, received only a bump on the head and was able to go home after the collision.
