

OPA CEILINGS PLACED ON ALL TIMBER SALES

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25 (AP)—Maximum prices for sales of all standing timber, both publicly and privately owned, in 12 western states were established today by the office of price administration (OPA).

OPA said the price schedules, which become effective August 31, were designed to restrain rising timber prices and further stabilize present ceilings for logs, lumber and other forest products.

Price controls set in 1941 for mills, wholesale distributors and retail dealers did not prove adequate in controlling price of timber to lumber producers, the agency said.

The new ceiling prices apply to all sales of publicly-owned timber involving \$1000 or more in Washington, Oregon, California, Montana, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, Wyoming, Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado and South Dakota.

The maximum prices will be the total of the appraised valuation plus fixed additions. The additions range from 40 cents per 1000 board feet, log scale, for timber appraised at \$1.50 per 1000 feet, log scale and under, to \$1.85 per 1000 feet for timber with an appraised value of \$10 per 1000 feet and higher.

The maximum prices for privately-owned timber will be at similar rates, based on prices prevailing for the nearest tract of publicly-owned standing timber.

SERVE SNAP BEANS IN MEAT-VEGETABLE DISH

Fresh snap beans — from truck crop fields or from victory gardens—supply vitamins A and C, riboflavin, nicotinic acid, calcium, iron and phosphorus. Home economists of the department of agriculture say: 1½ pounds to 2 pounds will serve 5 to 6 persons and give the following hints.

In wartime, American homemakers should combine vegetables and meat into main dishes. Snap beans are a headliner for such combinations. Try this: Melt 2 tablespoons drippings in heavy skillet; add 1 quart shredded snap beans; salt, and cover. Cook 20 to 25 minutes, turning beans frequently. Add 1 or 2 cups shredded cooked

pork and cook 5 minutes longer, until meat is thoroughly heated. Serve on toast.

Breddee

The South Africans have a bean dish called Breddee. To make it you need two pounds of the bony pieces of lamb, 3 chopped onions, 4 cups green beans sliced diagonally and very thin, 4 or 5 potatoes, sliced, 3 cups water, ¼ of a chili pepper finely sliced, and salt and pepper.

Brown the lamb and onions in lamb fat and other drippings if you need them; add the beans, potatoes, water and seasonings, including the chili pepper. Cover and cook slowly until vegetables are tender. Add more water if necessary. There should be a little liquid left

when served and the solid part should just begin to fry.

Cook sufficient beans at one time to have some left over for other meals. Store in covered container in refrigerator. To scallop left-over beans, make a medium white sauce, using the water in which beans were cooked and drippings or poultry fat or bacon fat and flour. Pour the sauce over the beans; add a little seasoning, sprinkle bread crumbs on top, and bake in moderate oven until crumbs are brown and sauce bubbling. For variation, add a little grated cheese, or heat the beans in white sauce with a dash of curry and some sour cream beaten into it.

How long should you cook beans? The answer depends on custom and individual taste, but it's a safe guess most housewives cook them too long. To save time and vitamins both, shred the beans or cut them into small pieces immediately before

cooking and cook only until tender and crisp.
