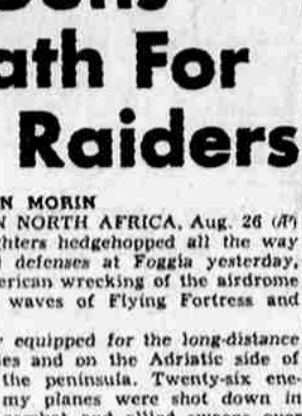
Army Stops Hawaii Judge From Forcing Fine on General

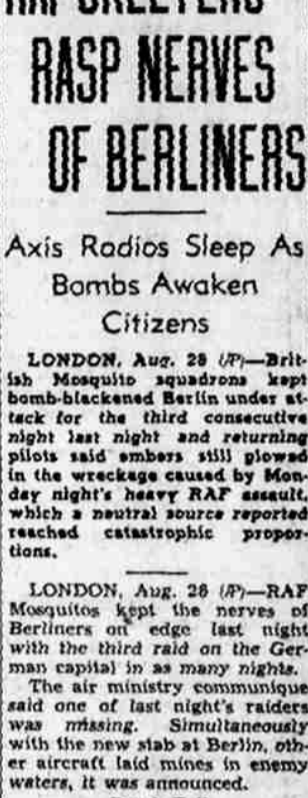
