fighting and guerrilla tactics in building up the commandos.

Direct Blow Seen

Thus, in Mountbatten's background, military observers found basis for speculation that a direct blow by air and sea may be aimed in the near future at the vital port of Rangoon, even as the offensive down the Arakan coast is continued with stepped-up intensity.

Success in reopening the Burma road would serve the double objective of getting more supplies in to the Chinese forces of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek, and as a route for bringing in fuel for allied planes and bombers for a close-up air attack on Japan from Chinese bases.

China Bases

Increased allied use of Chinese air bases might well compel Japan to pull in a substantial part of her air forces defending her outlying island empire, and thereby ease the tough northward drive confronting Gen. Douglas MacArthur.

Upon his arrival here, Mountbatten will find a special mission from his homeland which came to study "maximum British cooperation with the United States in future operations against Japan" with the specific of laying "the logistical foundation" for Britain's contribution in that objective.

Mountbatten will command American and Chinese as well as British, Canadian and Indian forces. One factor probably taken into consideration in his appointment is that the preponderance of his troops are British and principally natives.

the northwestern bend of the Dnieper.

Red Star said the Germans attempted to make a stand at Zenkov, concentrating numerous reserves and organizing special units for counterattacks.

Fight Along River

The battle for this point was fought along a river covering Zenkov from the east. The red army crossed the river at night, Red Star said, and forced Germans to withdraw.

The occupation of Zenkov, north of Oposhnya which was previously captured, indicated the soviets were making their main effort directly to the west instead of descending on the secondary objective of Poltava.

Another large German force was reported defeated in a battle for Akhtyrka, 25 miles northeast of Zenkov, which was finally taken by the red army yesterday after a seesaw struggle.

killed and 150 injured in clashes between the Danes and Germans and as a result of sabotage since August 16.

A critical food shortage developed in Fredericia, due to the blasting of railway lines in that area.

One Stockholm newspaper, Aftonbladet, speculated whether the Germans planned to institute military control, intern King Christian and strip the Danish government of its powers.

German troops and members of the gestapo moved into Roskilde, reputedly to "help the Danish authorities enforce the emergency regulations." Six other major Danish cities were placed under such a decree early this week.

FBI Nabs Two For \$92,000 Jewel Theft

WASHINGTON, Aug. 26 (AP)—Director J. Edgar Hoover of the federal bureau of investigation said today that the arrest of two men in Texas had resulted in the solution of the theft of \$92,000 of jewels from a woman identified as the divorced wife of a Persian prince.

The jewels were stolen from a trans-continental airplane which was grounded at Amarillo, Texas, November 22, 1942. Hoover said \$50,000 of the jewels had been recovered at Amarillo.

union policy committee meeting soon was given no support, although that has been the usual step when Lewis was planning new exploits.

The statutory status given the war labor board (WLB) which he since defied, the penalties for striking under the new war labor disputes act and the WLB compliance sanctions approved by the president apparently have forced Lewis to revamp his entire strategy. He may await the WLB's decision on the anthracite wage dispute before determining upon his next move.

Strike Disclaimed

The interpretation that a turn-back of the mines to private ownership automatically meant a strike is unofficially disclaimed in UMW circles. The policy committee's statement in June directed the miners to return to work until October 31 with the proviso that this agreement would "automatically terminate" if the government relinquishes its custody of the mines before then. UMW sources now say this was a reservation, not a threat and furthermore they emphasize that it was an official policy committee statement and not a personal commitment by Lewis. They say in effect, that no general work stoppage is contemplated, at least for the present.

the movement of German troops and supplies by railroad across her neutral soil between Germany and Norway and Finland only this month. The traffic had gone on three years.

The submarine Ulven was sunk with a crew of 33 during spring maneuvers off Marstrand in the Kattegatt, and divers who inspected the hull reported May 21 she apparently was destroyed by a mine.

Sweden was at the time awaiting Berlin's reply to her protests that Nazi mines had been found in Swedish territorial waters.

Other incidents have involved both ships and planes.
