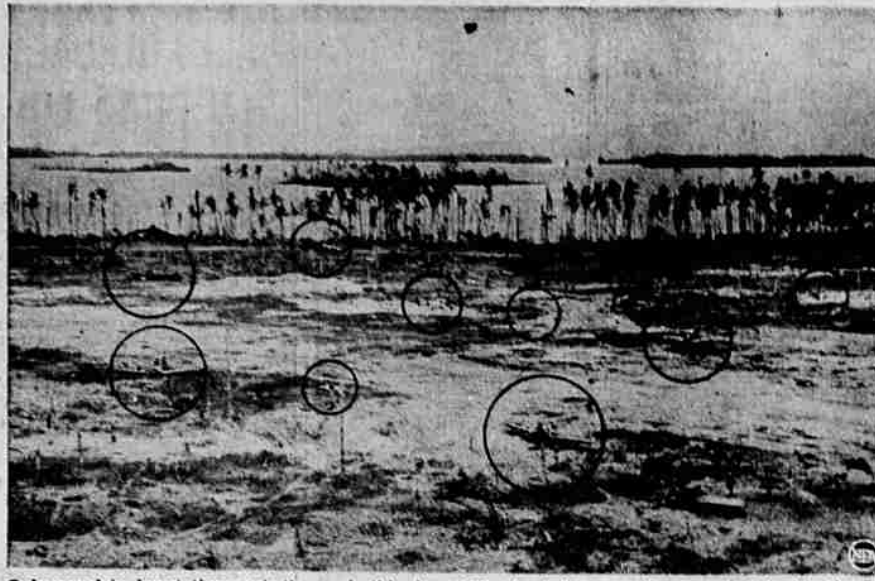

Efficient Use of United Nations Oil Backed by PAW

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25 (AP)—Steps to promote more efficient use of United Nations oil resources are being pushed steadily but quietly throughout the world.

The agencies taking part, so far as this country is concerned, are the petroleum administration for war (PAW), as principal developer of the program, and the petroleum Reserve corporation (PRC), as financial backer.

The movement got started less than two months ago, spurred by assertions of the United States oil industry that this country was supplying most of the United Nations' huge military machine and unless the load were spread we would suffer from depleted reserves after the war.

BISHOP ARMSTRONG MET BY CHURCHMEN

TULELAKE—Right Reverend Bishop Armstrong of the Sacramento diocese was greeted here by a number of dignitaries of Catholic churches of the Klamath basin upon his arrival here last week. While here he was the guest of Rev. James M. O'Conner, pastor of St. Augustine's church, Merrill. He was accompanied by Father Boland of Fort Jones.

Included among those who met Bishop Armstrong were Father Casey and Father Duignan and four sisters of the Sacred Heart academy, Klamath Falls, Father Joseph A. Hunt, Tulelake and Brother Charles, also of Tulelake.

While here, Bishop Armstrong read a 9:30 o'clock mass at the WRA center at Newell followed by confirmation for 16 Japanese, nine from Sacramento, four from Portland and three from San Francisco.

WRA CHANGES DISCUSSED AT ROTARY MEET

TULELAKE — Proposed changes in the WRA center at Newell that will be accomplished with the shifting of loyal and dis-loyal Japanese among the several camps of the west were discussed at this week's Rotary club meeting by C. E. Zimmer, assistant director at the project.

Following a brief history of the establishment of the camps, Zimmer stated that when the shift is made between 15,000 and 18,000 Japanese will be located here. 12,000 of the original number of approximately 15,000 are still in camp and of this number 4500 will be retained here. Six hundred of these brought here signed for repatriation and 20 from Newell, pooled with men and women from other camps, will leave New York this week for Japan in an exchange program agreed upon by the U. S. government and that of the Japanese. Among those being returned to Japan, 10 per cent have never lived there, nor do they know anything of life under military rule. Angered at internment since beginning of the war, they asked for deportation.

Five companies of soldiers, including the company which has been stationed here for many months, will be located here when the adjustment is completed.

A man-proof fence 6 feet high with a two foot wire overhang is to be built completely around the compound, Zimmer stated. Guard towers will be spaced every 900 feet around the enclosure. Farm land, where the Japanese will work under guard, will also be fenced. Internees will be checked in and out of the camp and will work under military guard. Japanese who have been in camp since it was opened have traveled to the farming area and elsewhere previous to this time without guard.

Change over to a disloyal camp will be completed about October 1.
