RUSSIAN tanks and cavalry are halfway today from Taganrog to Mariupol, the next railhead on the Sea of Azov to the west of Taganrog.

ON this Sea of Azov campaign, watch all references to Sinenikovo and Zaporozhe. These towns are junction points on the Kharkov-Crimea railroad where intersecting rail lines from east of the Dnieper river come in.

RAF night bombers hit Germany again in force last night at factory and railroad towns in the immediate neighborhood of Duesseldorf, on the Rhine. Twenty-eight bombers are lost.
