HOME-CANNED FOODS DROP IN POINT VALUES

Reduction in the ration value of home-canned foods which have a point value higher than corresponding commercial varieties was announced today by the OPA.

Today's amendment provides that the point value of home-canned foods shall be the same as that of the corresponding commercial product, except that no home-canned food shall have a point value of more than the present uniform value of 8 points per quart, or 4 points per pound.

Items affected by today's order, currently listed at less than eight points per quart in the official table which is now in use, are as follows:

Plums or prunes, 7 points.
All fruit juices, except pineapple, 3 points.
Sauerkraut, 7 points.
Mixed vegetable juices with 70 per cent or more of tomato juice, 3 points.
Tomato soup, 7 points.
Ready-to-serve soups, 3 points.
All frozen fruit juices, 2 points per pound.
This action is effective September 8, 1943.

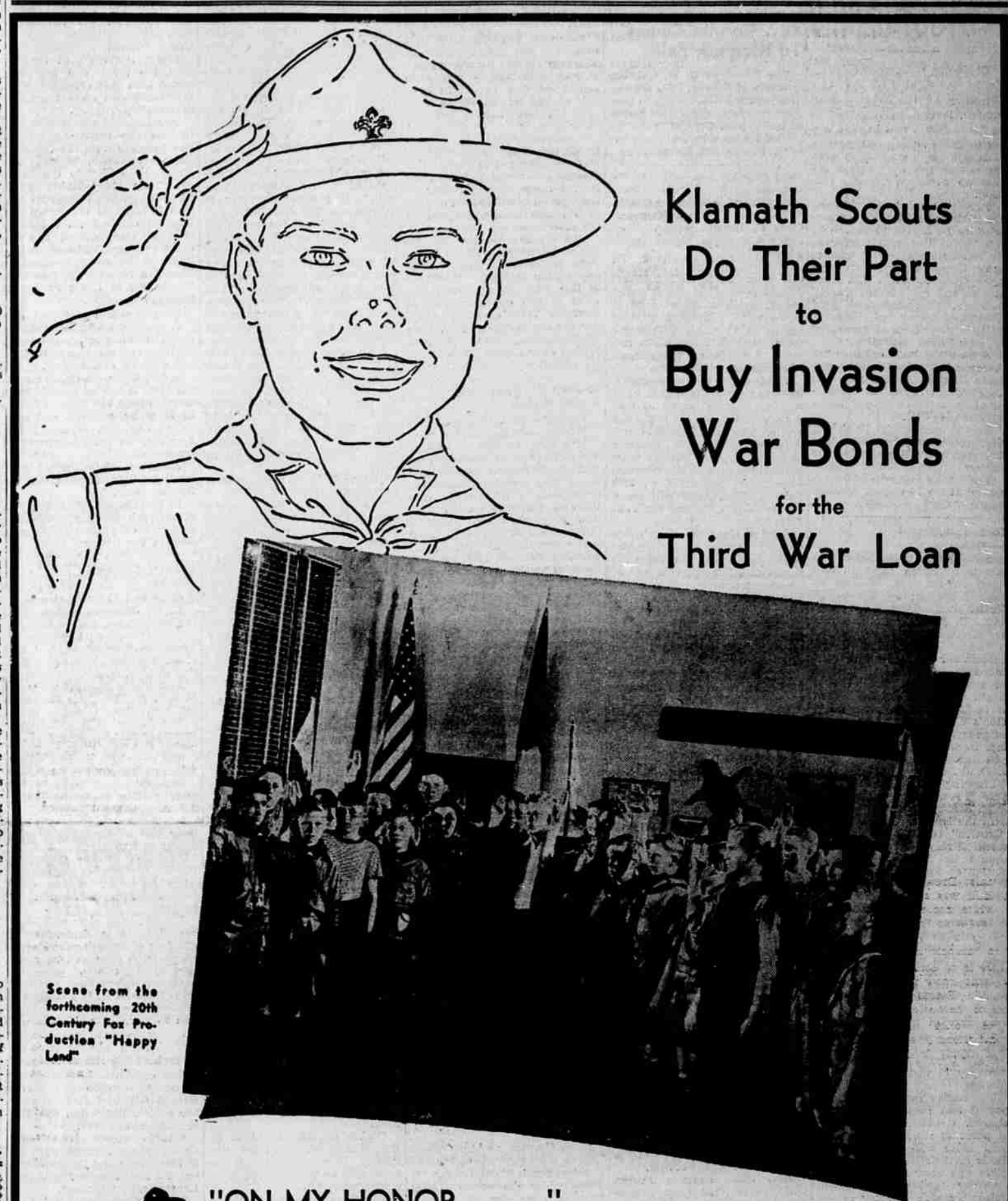
When city officials saw the map they had an enlargement made to put in the city hall. The map cost the city about \$375, \$300 for the map itself and \$75
