The Russians also announced the capture of five populated places and three railway stations, including Alexeyevskaya, 40 miles south of Kharkov, in their drive toward the Pavlograd.

Kiev Drive

They said that Kunashovka, five miles east of the important town of Nezhin, had fallen to the Russians. This would place the Russians approximately 70 miles east of that Ukraine fortress on the Dnieper.

Bryansk had been a German communications center since 1941.

Evacuation of the key town city, held by the Germans since October, 1941, was acknowledged today by the German radio soon after Moscow reported that the oncoming red army was closing in on the city on the west bank of the Desna river.

Disrupt Rail Net

Disruption of the rail network vital for German winter transport heightened belief in London that the nazis would not be able to halt their retreat now before reaching the west bank of the Dnieper.

The speed of their withdrawal toward Kiev and Dnepropetrovsk on the lower reaches of the river, where only three inadequate bridges and ferry crossings are available, raised hopes that large forces of nazis might be trapped on the east bank of the Dnieper or even be overtaken while attempting to cross it.

The German broadcast by DNB declared Bryansk (normal population 87,000) had been evacuated in good order, and the troops had not been encircled or injured to "a considerable degree."

Again Berlin preceded Moscow in announcing the victory for Russian arms.

Colonel Reduced to Low Grade Captain For Shooting Negro

SELFRIDGE FIELD, Mich., Sept. 14 (AP)—Col. William T. Colman, former commandant at this army air base, was reduced in rank to a captain today by a general courtmartial that tried him on 28 counts of violating the articles of war. The court ordered him placed at the foot of the list of captains, not to be promoted for three years.

Col. Colman was convicted of careless use of firearms in the shooting of Private William R. McRae, negro chauffeur and of four charges of drunkenness. He was acquitted of other charges. Among the latter were allegations that he had allegedly arranged transfers for enlisted personnel to the field here and that he had accepted for his private use a vacation lodge from a Bay City Mich., contracting firm.

Sisemore Named to Administrator For Money Paid James

ALBANY, Sept. 14 (AP)—Probate Judge E. G. Arnold said today he had named L. Orth Sisemore, Klamath county district attorney, administrator for any funds paid Lt. Com. Richard F. James, widower of Mrs. Martha Virginia James, victim in the "lower 13" knife slaying aboard a Southern Pacific train last January.

James filed a claim for damages against the railroad. Sisemore's petition to become administrator said the railroad and the Pullman company, though denying liability, had offered \$10,000 in full settlement. Sisemore would receive the fund in trust.

Capture Cosenza

Allied headquarters announced that the British had captured Cosenza in an advance up the toe, and seized Bari, 65 miles above Brindisi on the Adriatic coast. The British were pushing up past Cosenza and were only about 100 miles south of the lower hinge of the fifth army bridgehead. Eboli is 15 miles southeast of Salerno itself.

Navy Guns Thunder

Allied tanks, infantry and planes supported by thunderous naval guns battled the Germans seeking to widen the Salerno area bridgehead only several miles deep at the maximum advance.

The points where the nazis regained ground were not identified by headquarters.

Field Marshal Gen. Albert Kesselring threw to armored divisions and the famous, reconstituted Hermann Goering division against Lt. Gen. Mark W. Clark's fifth army, and overhead increasing numbers of nazi planes were engaged by hundreds of allied bombers and fighters.

No Withdrawal

(There was not the slightest indication of any withdrawal from Salerno as reported by the Germans, who said the withdrawal was continuing this morning, after beginning Monday afternoon. Transocean said it was being made "in complete disorder.")

No Details

The allied communique gave no details of the situation at Salerno, saying merely: "Heavy fighting continues on the fifth army front. The Germans are counter-attacking desperately and at certain points

have regained some of the ground taken by us."

The eighth army advanced approximately 10 miles up the west coast of Italy to reach Cosenza, 90 miles from Reggio di Calabria and at about the center of the arch of the Italian foot. Cosenza is about 120 airline miles from Salerno.

On the heel of the boot other British forces were expanding their holdings out of Taranto and Brindisi.

One column was at Bari, 65 miles north of Brindisi on the Adriatic, and another, cutting diagonally across the heel from Taranto, was at Gioja, about midway between the naval base and Bari.
