A. W. SCHAUPP QUILTS LOCAL CO COUNCIL

G. A. Krause, commander of the Klamath county defense council, announced Tuesday the resignation of Arthur W. Schaupp as vice commander of the council, a position held by Schaupp since the organization of the defense corps.

In his resignation Schaupp said that his duties as a member of the State Highway commission takes so much of his time that he could not continue his job on the defense council.

Krause in commenting upon Schaupp's decision, paid high tribute to the time and effort the latter had given the defense council and stated that he would be sorely missed in the organization.

It was announced Tuesday that L. Orth Sisemore had been appointed new vice commander. Sisemore has previously served in several other capacities and has for some time been acting as controller of the council.

Sisemore's place as controller will be taken over by Harold Franey, who previously has held the position of chief of the city auxiliary police. Taking the auxiliary police chief job will be Orvil Hamilton, assistant city police chief. Odell Olson will be Hamilton's assistant.

Krause announced that these changes will be effective at once, and that the winter session of the training program will be resumed in a very short time.

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FIVE PER CENT OF DRAFT TO BE FATHERS

SALEM, Sept. 14 (AP)—Only five per cent of the men drafted in Oregon in October will be pre- Pearl Harbor fathers, Col. Elmer V. Wooton, state selective service director, said today.

All fathers drafted next month will be those in non-deferrable jobs.

More than 50 per cent of the draftees will be single men, he said, and most of the remainder will be either married men without children, or married men with children born after Pearl Harbor.

Sgt. Morrison With First Troops to Land on Kiska

Landing on the bleak island of Kiska in the Aleutians and expecting a fight to the finish with Japanese troops garrisoned there, Sgt. Robert Morrison of Klamath Falls was among the first American troops to set foot on the island.

"We thought for a few days we were in the war," writes Sgt. Morrison, "but it turned out that the Japs didn't think any more of this place than I do—only sooner—so we just walked in and set up camp."

"This (Kiska) is a weird country, not a tree showing, and the only vegetation is a heavy grass growing through moss. The combination of this grass and moss makes moving about a bit of a job. The ground is just like a sponge, as it rains about half the time. When it isn't raining, it's foggy."
