to a 40-mile wide neck of land north of that port on the Taman peninsula.

Premier Joseph Stalin disclosed the capture in a special order of the day, recorded here by the soviet monitor.

With Fleet Russian troops in the northern Caucasus cooperated with units of the Black sea fleet in the combined land and sea operation. The vital port was taken by storm today after five days of fierce fighting during which the Russians routed three German divisions, a Rumanian division and detachments of German marines. Marshal Stalin announced.

With the fall of the Kuban delta port toppled Hitler's faded hope of Caucasus oil.

Kuban Debacle There was no immediate indication of how much, if anything, the Germans were able to save from the Kuban debacle but with the complete rout of the four enemy divisions and marine detachments—roughly 50,000 defenders—there seemed little likelihood that the nazis had been able or would be able to pull much out of the wreckage of the defeat.

Presumably a small amount of the Kuban delta remained to be mopped up, but Novorossisk was its great prize and the last strongly defended port.

MOSCOW, Sept. 16 (AP)—Red army troops surging swiftly toward Kiev and Zaporozhe, key cities on the Dnieper river, were reported today to have ripped apart the German defenses east of the river.

The army newspaper Red Star said the Germans no longer held a continuous line.

principal target of the night-flying formations which concentrated on a factory supplying much needed tires for Hitler's war machine.

The Vichy radio said the town of Chartres also was attacked, but the British announcement made no mention of this.

American Fortresses, Liberators and Marauders dropped bombs on the Hispana-Suiza and Caudron-Renault aircraft plants and a ball bearing works in the dusk assault.

At the same time German air raiders subjected suburban London to one of its severest bombings in months.

Last night's operations cost the RAF eight bombers and two fighters, the air ministry said. One enemy plane was shot down. Although clouds made it difficult to see the results of the bombing at Mountlucan, the communique said first reports indicated that the attack was effective.

being brought up. It was probable that as many as five had been employed in the all-out effort to smash the allied grip.

Drain Germans The magnitude and fierceness of the battle undoubtedly was draining German strength even more rapidly than Marshal Erwin Rommel's effort in Africa.

Gen. Sir Bernard L. Montgomery's eighth army, racing dramatically up the Italian west coast, with the Italian toe behind it, passed through the ancient fishing village of Scalca, approximately 50 miles airline southeast of Agropoli, the southern anchor of Gen. Clark's position, allied headquarters announced.

Gen. Montgomery's dust-stained warriors were meeting no opposition in the dash that had carried them more than 15 miles in the last 24 hours.

Although Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's headquarters communique said the fifth army had strengthened its hold on its bridgehead and was being reinforced and supplied, it was not considered likely that the critical phase would pass until it had been joined by the eighth army to form a great unified force.
