REV. GILBERT BROWN PASSES AWAY SUDDENLY

The Rev. Gilbert D. Brown of Klamath Agency, who had served for the past year as pastor of the Chilcoquin Methodist church, passed away suddenly Sunday morning at the age of 72 years. Mr. Brown's death was attributed to a heart ailment. Although the Rev. Mr. Brown had not served as active pastor since this past June, he was a regular attendant at the Sunday services and faithful in his devotion to his church.

Mr. Brown had been a Methodist minister for 51 years and during that long period of service never missed one day nor was out of his pulpit for one service because of sickness, until his retirement. He had served most of his ministry in South Dakota and was a member of the Methodist conference of the Dakota conference in South Dakota besides a number of pastorate.

In Oregon he served churches at Freewater and Chilcoquin strengthening the churches at both places. He had served some of the leading churches in the state of South Dakota and the churches he served in Oregon were profited by his long training and experience as well as his kindly spirit and Christian loyalty.

Rev. Brown is survived by his wife, Mrs. Ida Brown, who is a nurse at the Klamath Agency hospital, three daughters, Mrs. Vivian Fobes, of Council Bluffs, Ia., Mrs. Katherine Dawgton, of Lincoln, Neb., Mrs. Marjorie Miller, of San Gabriel, Calif., also one son, Gerald Brown, of Des Moines, Ia., and also 10 grandchildren.

It is also interesting to note that Rev. Mr. Brown's father, the Rev. Samuel F. Brown, served as a minister of the Methodist church for 49 years, father and son thus completing a full century in the ministry of the Methodist church.

Funeral services were held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock in Ward's funeral chapel with the Rev. Victor Phillips, pastor of the First Methodist church in Klamath Falls in charge, assisted by the district superintendent, Dr. Silas E. Fairman of Salem, Rev. B. V. Bradshaw of Williamson River and Ross Ferguson, members of the Masonic lodge of Chilcoquin will act as pallbearers.
