

FDR GUIDES CONGRESS IN POSTWAR PLAN

WASHINGTON, Sept. 18 (AP)—President Roosevelt's suggestion that the good neighbor policy of the western hemisphere be extended to the rest of the world as peace insurance furnished a generally sympathetic congress today with a guide for action on its own post-war foreign policy resolutions in the coming weeks.

The Fullbright resolution putting congress on record as favoring United States membership in international machinery with adequate power to prevent aggression will be considered in the house Monday under procedure barring amendments and requiring a two-thirds vote to pass. A small group seeking to qualify such an advance commitment will contest the method of consideration.

Senate action is expected later on a similar proposal to be written by a foreign relations subcommittee which probably will provide for the use of force in an international organization created to block incipient warmakers.

Readiness to utilize force has been advocated by Secretary of State Hull and Chairman Connally (D-Tex.) of the senate foreign relations group. While the word "force" has no place in the inter-American system of mutual cooperation in settling hemispheric disputes, administration officials said the president was speaking very generally about extending the good neighbor policy to the world and that this did not necessarily mean he would oppose the use of armies and navies to put down aggressions.

SALERNO LANDING COSTS U. S. SHIPS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 18 (AP)—The landing of the fifth army at Salerno cost at least two United States warships.

The 1500-ton destroyer Rowan went down as the result of an "underwater explosion" off the Italian coast Saturday, two days after the Salerno beachhead was established, a navy communique disclosed last night.

Enemy action caused the sinking of the 1450-ton tug Naussett in the Mediterranean Thursday, the day of the landing.

The communique also announced the loss of the USS Navajo, sister-ship of the Naussett, from an underwater explosion in the South Pacific Sunday.

The sinkings brought to 117 the number of United States fighting craft lost since the war started.

No casualty reports have been received as yet from either the Rowan, which had a normal complement of 172, or the Navajo, which carried about 60 men, the navy said.

All three ships were comparatively new. The Rowan was commissioned in the fall of 1939, the Navajo in 1940, and the Naussett in March of this year.

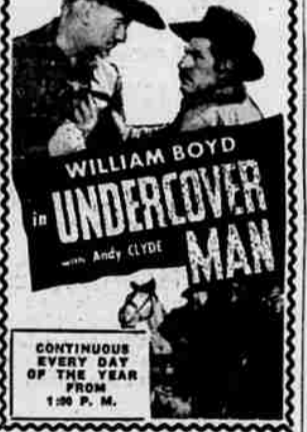
