

# GOOD HEALTH THEME OF BIG PROGRAM HERE

"Good Health is a Weapon" is the theme of an intensive educational health program which was launched in every town and community, including Klamath Falls, this week by the Oregon State Board of Health in cooperation with the Oregon State Defense Council, according to an announcement by Dr. Frederick D. Stricker, state health officer.

The program stresses that because all communities have suffered great losses in available medical and dental professionals, each person should take every possible precaution against contagious and communicable diseases. To that end 12 points have been enumerated which citizens should remember and follow as closely as possible.

1. Protect children and adults against communicable diseases by immunization especially against diphtheria and smallpox.
2. Keep children away from all sick persons.
3. Keep children at home if they are ill.
4. Maintain sanitary conditions in your home, block and community. Report rats and mosquitoes to your local health department.
5. Eat the right foods. Conserve food values by proper storage and cooking.
6. Keep cheerful and busy. Don't forget to play.
7. Wear proper clothing and maintain room temperature at 65 degrees.
8. Expectant mothers should seek medical care early. The health of the mother and baby depends on proper care.
9. When ill, get a competent physician's advice early.
10. Give yourself a chance. Children and adults should have periodic physical examinations by a competent physician and dentist. Any evidence of illness should receive immediate attention.
11. Know and practice good home nursing care.
12. Call upon your local health department for help in detecting the health of those living in your block.

hold the SEAPORT of Split, on the Dalmatian coast, across the Adriatic from Italy. Some sort of crisis in Hungary is rumored. British commandos are said to have landed on the island of Rhodes (just off Turkey) and to have been joined after landing by Italian troops.

THIS fog of secrecy is more or less significant, as quite often we have to judge as much by the news we're NOT HEARING as by what we do hear. Censorship is apt to be tightest where the fires are hottest.

IN Russia, "strong rainfall, which lasted for days" is reported today. At any time now there will be a brief interval in Russia when General Mud will be in command. After the mud will come the WINTER FREEZE. Russians fight well in winter.

LAE (in New Guinea) falls after its last defenses are pounded to pieces by our bombers and the Australians sweep in. A few Jap prisoners are taken. A few Jap stragglers are left to be killed. What has happened to the 20,000-odd Japs supposed to have been there is a mystery that is not cleared for us.

OF Lae's fall, MacArthur says: "With God's help, we are making our way BACK TO BATAAN."

CHIANG says today: "The surrender of the Italian fleet determines Japan's ultimate doom." He's telling his Chinese followers that while they haven't had much help from us so far they'll get MORE now that the Mediterranean shipping route is open.

ON the home front, which for most of us is the bond front, you may be asking this question: "Why should I buy bonds until it hurts?"

THIS is answer No. 1: Because it is your DUTY. This is YOUR country. It is YOUR job to save it. Wars have to be financed, just as they have to be FOUGHT.

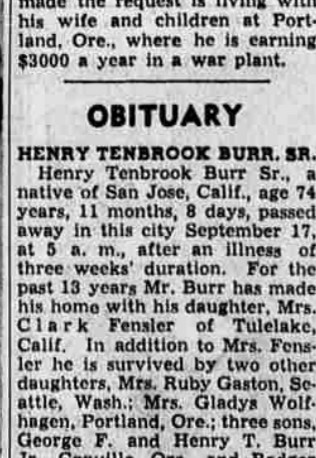

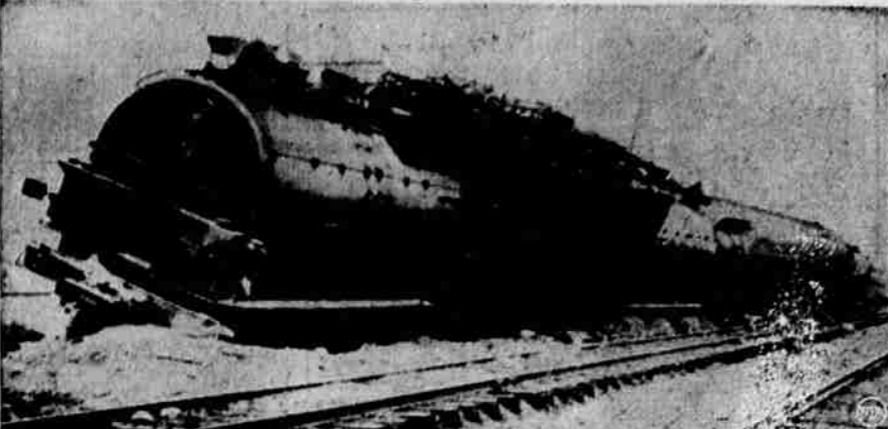

sica and eight miles from the jutting Italian west coast, and surrender of its 7000 Italian troops. Elba, Napoleon's first home in exile, is about 120 miles northwest of Rome.

Allied Spearhead

The allied spearhead driving into the crumbling German flank in the extreme southern Salerno bridgehead captured the town of Roccadaspide, 11 miles inland from the coast, the bulletin announced.

The initiative was fully in allied hands in this bitterly fought bridgehead, with more reinforcements being poured in, and allied air and sea might beating at the Nazis.

The familiar pattern of the allied attack was seen again as northwest African airforces started pounding Nazi airfields south of Rome.

Italian Airfields

For the first time, allied planes now are operating from airfields on the Italian mainland, it was announced, an indication that ground troops were getting elbow room in the Salerno area. Before, the fighters had to fly all the way from Sicily.

Capture of Roccadaspide indicated the Germans were abandoning their mountain positions from which their 88-millimeter guns had pounded the beachhead.

The Nazis still were fighting desperately north of Salerno, and holding the mountain passes leading down into the south side of the Bay of Naples, and their next great stand undoubtedly will be in defense of that bomb-wrecked seaport.

There are at least six German divisions in the area, although those engaged against the fifth army unquestionably were heavily battered.

Taranto Quiet

The British force which landed at Taranto, the fifth allied corps, remained comparatively inactive, except for strengthened contact with the British just north of the instep of the "boot."

For three days allied planes have been virtually unmolested in striking as far north as Rome, and now with the weather perfect, a successful German retreat from the Salerno sector is going to be extremely difficult.

# LOCAL AMMUNITION PROBLEM REFERRED

The matter of obtaining ammunition for getting rid of predatory animals and wild fowl which are annoying farmers in this area has been referred to the war production board in Washington D. C., County Agent C. A. Henderson announced today.

Action will undoubtedly be too late to relieve farmers who are bothered with wild fowl in their grainfields, Henderson said, but ammunition may be made available for shooting predatory animals.

Requests for the ammunition should be made through the county USDA war board offices.

Henderson reported that in California rice fields, bombs had been used to frighten away ducks and geese, but that this method would be impracticable here because of the danger of setting fires.

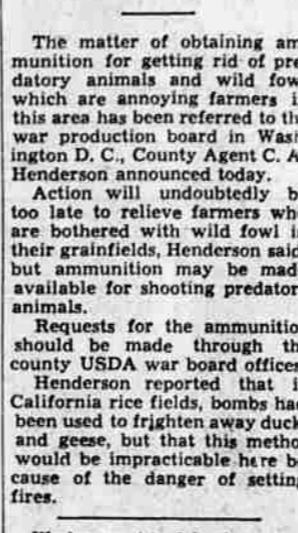

situation is not as potentially critical as at first feared. Potato digging will get into full swing about October 1, and indications are there will be an emergency demand for all available help from the city and suburbs.

Mexican nationals in Klamath county and in the Tulelake area are helping materially at this time, but the digging program is still on slow bell and this labor, as well as that from the normal transient sources, cannot possibly fill the bill, it was brought out. While there has been some grower complaint, it was reported that in general the Mexicans are doing a competent job.

# SLEDGEHAMMER AERIAL BLOWS AID CAPTURE

razed its last defenses Thursday morning with 43 tons of bombs, the Australians who marched in and raised their flag on Lae's control tower found only a few stragglers among the ruins to kill.

Tons of Bombs

A spokesman for General MacArthur said that 1800 tons of bombs were dropped on the now

captured air bases of Lae and Salamaua—1000 tons in August alone—during a campaign against a Japanese army estimated at one time to have totalled 20,000 men. How many of these perished remains to be computed, the last estimate by an allied general of 8000 having been made midway in the operations. A few prisoners were taken.

75 Raids

Lae has been raided on 75 days since the drive over tortuous jungle and ridge against northeastern New Guinea got under way from the allied Papan base of Buna last January 28. Sea barges, the enemy garrison's principal means of supply, were so continuously attacked that 500 were destroyed in a month.

In the closing stages Lae was rounded into a shambles.

Flight Foreseen

Flight of the enemy remnants north had been foreseen. Blockades, some manned by American

paratroops, had been built across trails leading into mountains which rise nearly 14,000 feet. "Destruction of these remnants is certain," today's communique said.

Lae, with its two airfields, has been used by the Japanese as their main New Guinea coastal base since they occupied it in January, 1942.

Postwar Increase In Air Travel Forecast

WENATCHEE, Sept. 18 (AP)—A period of tremendous air travel after the war was predicted today by Charles I. Stanton, Washington, D. C., administrator of civil aeronautics.

He told the northwest aviation planning council here that one-seventh of the war budget—a sum of \$20,100,000—is being spent in airplane production this year.
