

# PORT AFLAME; NAZIS PUSHED INTO CORNER

enemy was establishing a strong defense line on the approaches to Salerno from the south and east, but the extent of their demolitions in and near the city appeared evidence that the Germans hoped to hold back allied attack toward the city from the Salerno area.

### Fights East

The 5th army meanwhile fought its way steadily east and northeast from Salerno with American troops capturing the towns of Campagna and Montecorvino-Rovella while the British chased fleeing Germans from the town of San Cipriano.

On Corsica French soldiers and native patrols pursued a German garrison estimated at 12,000 men toward the eastern shores while American Liberator bombers blasted at the principal avenue of German evacuation from the island—the Corsican harbor of Bastia and the Italian port of Lghorn.

### Nothing to Add

The military spokesman said he had "nothing to add" to Winston Churchill's statement yesterday that American troops had landed on Sardinia, but the belief prevailed here that whatever units were sent to that island intended only to cooperate with an Italian division which already at Premier Pietro Badoglio's command took control and compelled the Germans to flee.

Another menace to the Germans on the Italian mainland, Gen. Sir Bernard L. Montgomery's 8th army, drove northward and inland and occupied the key highway and rail center of Potenza.

Occupation of Potenza, which is a junction point of five main roads, gave the allies control of the entire inland highway and rail systems south of a line extending eastward from Salerno.

bulletin, were they able to halt the surging red army tide."

LET'S turn now from fighting to POLITICS.

IN London today, Anthony Eden "discloses that Rudolph Hess (then No. 2 Nazi) told the Duke of Hamilton (on whose estate in Scotland he landed by plane) that the foeher (Hitler) "does not want to defeat England, and he wants to stop fighting."

That has been kept a dark secret for two years.

WHY is it "disclosed" now?

### HERE'S a guess:

Hess flew to England in an effort to make a separate peace with Britain so that Hitler could GO AFTER RUSSIA FOR BLOOD, with nobody at his back door to be afraid of.

That was kept secret for two years. The fact that Eden "discloses" it now must have some particular significance at this time.

So let's guess again: Britain, right now, must want very much to prove to Stalin that she STOOD BY HIM in a grave pinch two years ago.

Why RIGHT NOW?

### WE'LL have to go on guessing:

Stalin, for realistic reasons of his own, prefers to keep us and the British (especially the British) OUT of the Balkans—presumably being confident of his OWN ability to handle the Germans down that way and preferring to keep himself free from entanglements when the time comes (after the war) to go after what Russia WANTS FOR HERSELF—such as warm water ports, "buffer" states, etc.

If these guesses are anywhere near the truth, they mean that the much-discussed "second" front has its POLITICAL side.

That is to say, Stalin wants us to do our fighting in western Europe and STAY OUT of the Balkans—because, if we HELP HIM lick the Germans DOWN THERE we (especially the British) will have a legitimate claim to some of the spoils of victory.

If he licks the Germans alone, Russia will have SOLE claim to the spoils.

The British want what they regard as their legitimate share of the spoils in that part of the world.

### ONE dislikes to deal with speculation of this sort, but history tells us very plainly indeed that in world wars, political considerations are always present in the minds of the higher-ups.

# COURT, LUMBER ASK FOR FUNDS TO FIX ROADS

Klamath county court and Weyerhaeuser, Ivory Pine and Pelican Bay Lumber companies have joined in making an application to the United States public works administration for funds to improve the woods road running to Weyerhaeuser camp 6 near Beatty.

The application asks the government for \$4500 a mile for approximately 16 miles of road. The road starts near Ivory Pine's mill and goes into Weyerhaeuser camp 6, and will also be used by Pelican Bay, which is establishing a camp six miles north of the Weyerhaeuser camp.

The U. S. government, according to County Judge U. E. Reeder, provides money for the building or improving of roads coming under the classification of "access roads to raw materials."

# Marshall Nomination Sets Up Storm of Hitler's Fortress

"Marshall would be one of the best leaders in the world for such a post." Unofficial comment generally was favorable.

### Assure Cooperation

Marshall's projected appointment, particularly with respect to the European theater, is designed to assure close coordination among all the armies now in action as well as those slated for assault on what Mr. Roosevelt said would be shown in due time to be the vulnerable parts of Hitler's fortress.

Such coordination has been supplied to date by the combined chiefs of staff, of which Marshall is a principal member. But military observers have long expected that when the time for numerous and large scale actions approached this remote control system would be supplanted by a single, on-the-spot director.

# NAZIS MAULED BACK TO EAST WALL BY REDS

and nowhere, according to the latest Moscow war bulletin, were they able to halt the surging red army tide.

The last formidable barrier before the Dnieper on the central front was battered down yesterday when a savage soviet drive slashed across the Desna river line between Bryansk and Kiev. With the capture of Chernigov, most important German base on the lower reaches of this river, the way was open for red army forces to strike directly at Kiev and Gomel. The latter, 80 miles northwest of Chernigov, is the gateway to White Russia.

### 30 Miles From Dnieper

At Chernigov, the Russians were 30 miles from Dnieper, 25 miles from the southern border of White Russia while the old Polish border was less than 100 miles to the west. Stalingrad, high water mark of the German advance, is more than 600 miles southeast of Chernigov.

Another thousand odd towns and villages were liberated by Russian advances yesterday, while upwards of 700 Nazi troops were slain and many more captured, the Russian communique said. Soviet guns destroyed 80 enemy tanks and 34 more were listed in the enormous quantities of war equipment said to have been left by the Germans in their precipitous retreat.

### Trains Blasted

In addition, the soviet air force, credited with 63 Nazi planes destroyed over the front yesterday, blasted concentrations of railway trains at Gomel, Vietsk and Dzhankoi on the central front last night, setting many of them afire.

In their drive to push the invaders from Russian soil, the red army spearheads were within 18 miles of Smolensk, which was slowly being flanked on the north and south.

had come to Britain on a "mission of humanity."

Hamilton, who was a wing commander in the RAF and did not recall having met Hess before, flew to London and reported the conversation.

Hamilton told the authorities he believed the prisoner was Hess. This fact was confirmed by I. A. Kirkpatrick of the foreign office, who had known Hess and who talked to him May 13, 14 and 15.

Hess' aim was to convince responsible British persons that England could not win and its wisest course was to make an immediate peace.

### Stress Airpower

Hess stressed Germany's power in the air and in U-boats and averred that Britain would be beaten by a blockade at least within two or three years. He expressed horror at a prolongation of the struggle.

He gave his "word of honor" that Hitler never intended to wreck the British empire or dominate the world.

# Collier to Be Candidate For Congress Seat

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Sept. 22 (AP)—Senator Randolph Collier of Yreka said today he expects to be a candidate for the republican nomination for the congressional seat which Senator Clair Engle, Red Bluff democrat, won at the August 31 special election to choose a successor to the late Congressman Harry L. Englebright.

Collier said he plans a pre-campaign survey of the 18-county foothill and mountain counties of the second congressional district with the view to lining up republican strength behind his bid, in hopes the republican groups can center up on him and avoid a split such as that in August when two republicans polling 18,000 votes combined lost to a democrat who received approximately 12,000.

ation for a 50 per cent postwar refund.

### Refund to Be Paid

Thus the basic rate—now 8 per cent normal, plus 13 per cent first bracket surtax, plus 3 per cent net victory tax, a total of 22 per cent—would be 6 per cent plus 26 per cent, a total of 32 per cent. Of that amount, however, 13 per cent would be paid back after the war.

Should Mr. Roosevelt reject the program, Treasury Secretary Morgenthau probably will offer an alternative proposal calling for stiff increases in social security taxes. These now are one per cent for both employer and employee but are scheduled to double January 1 unless congress acts as it has before to postpone the increase.

Although opposed to a broad compulsory savings plan, the secretary is reported to favor the idea of a refundable tax because it would ease any inflationary threat and at the same time provide a backlog of postwar buying power.
