situation" at one time, but soviet artillery came to its relief. No further progress was reported immediately in the directions of Zaporozhe and Dnepropetrovsk, two major objectives on the lower Dnieper. Zaporozhe lies on the east bank of the Dnieper behind a solid ring of fortifications. The main part of Dnepropetrovsk, the suburbs of which already have been reached, lies on the west bank.

Ground Lost  
(Today's German communique, as broadcast by Berlin, said German troops, engaged in heavy defensive fighting on the Dnieper warfront, lost ground temporarily yesterday but wiped out their losses with counterattacks.

(The communique added Russian attacks at several points on the west bank of the Central Dnieper were frustrated. It reported Russian bombers raided Constanta, Rumanian Black sea port).

# OREGON TO REACH WAR LOAN QUOTA

SALEM, Sept. 29 (AP)—Oregon will reach its war loan quota, Governor Earl Snell said today in a letter advising Governor Dwight Griswold of Nebraska to start greasing up the pig which he bet against Snell.

# PASSENGER TIRE QUOTA DROPPED

WASHINGTON, Sept. 29 (AP)—An October quota which will cut by one-fifth the number of new passenger tires available for rationing was announced today by the office of price administration.

Reflecting the low level of new tire stocks, the quota is 645,000 tires as compared with 829,639 for September.

Based on allotments assigned by the office of rubber director, the October quota is set in line with recent OPA action to reduce ration demand by raising mileage requirements. Starting October 1, only car owners who need to drive 601 miles or more a month qualify for new tires.

# Editor Waits Trial On Libel Charge

PRINCESS ANNE, Md., Sept. 29 (AP)—Indicted by a grand jury and held under \$500 bail, Rives Skinner Matthews, editor and publisher of the Weekly Somerset News, awaits trial next week on a charge of criminal libel arising from stories published in his paper concerning Maryland Comptroller I. Millard Tawes.

The grand jury, in handing down the indictment yesterday, said Matthews had "intended to vilify and defame" Tawes in articles published in the newspaper last June in connection with Matthews' accusations that Tawes had misused gasoline ration coupons.

# NAZIS DRIVEN FROM HEIGHTS OVER SALERNO

general advance on the entire fifth and eighth army line. American troops on the fifth army's right flank smashed their way six miles northward against crumbling enemy opposition and were within seven miles of Avellino, road and rail junction which is the key to inland communications east of Naples.

The capture of Avellino would constitute a threat to any German effort to make a new stand east or south of Naples. Salient Wiped Out  
The British eighth army meant while wiped out the deep Salient on its western flank, previously reported, and established a straight line between San Angelo and Melfi, while along the Adriatic Gen. Sir Bernard L. Montgomery's forces stormed northward from Margherita Di Savoia and occupied the town of Zappanetta on the Gulf of Manfredonia, due east of the great Foglia air base.

British troops on the extreme southwest end of the allied front began the final shove against the enemy in the mountain line north and northwest of Salerno and encountered the bitterest kind of fighting at the town of Sala which already had changed hands many times in recent weeks of the furious struggle.

Clark Sweeps In  
This time Clark's troops seized it for keeps and swept on triumphantly. The Germans, realizing that any further attempt to make a stand in that area was futile, began to retreat.

Reports from the front emphasized that the enemy's withdrawal was orderly and there was no suggestion that the allies were taking any large numbers of prisoners.

LONDON, Sept. 29 (AP)—The Berlin radio said today that German troops had evacuated several towns and villages northeast of Naples, the big Italian port threatened with imminent capture by allied troops. Two towns named in the broadcast, however, are southeast of Naples. These were named as Castel San Giorgio, three miles east of Nocera, and Baronissi, five miles north of Salerno.

Berlin also reported that American reinforcements had arrived in the Salerno sector and that an allied attack had been launched on the road leading from Vietri, on the Sorrento peninsula west of Salerno, to the northwest.

The Germans said that in the sector northeast of Naples their troops had withdrawn to shortened positions in the mountains and had evacuated Montoro and other towns after destroying all military installations. Montoro is about 11 miles north of Salerno and due east of Naples.

# Negation Won't Help Republicans, Says Wendell Willkie

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 29 (AP)—Wendell L. Willkie, 1940 candidate for president, said today that his party "can't win by a process of negation, and wouldn't deserve to."

"More captious criticism of the policies of the present administration would not entitle the republican party to victory," Willkie said at a press conference.

The 1940 republican standard bearer said that he will confer Friday morning with Earl Warren, California's republican governor, who often has been mentioned as a possible GOP nominee, either for president or vice president.

"In order to increase production," Jones said, "we want to be able to meet that rise (in production costs) in our farm price supports."

"In my judgment, the best way to get production is to have a definite support price that will last throughout the season. It should be high enough to cover the added risks and hazards that go with increased production. And it should be announced early."

"This means," the administrator said, "that the government would stand ready to buy any surplus of a commodity that might not flow into the regular channels at the time, and to absorb whatever loss may be necessary."
