Duties of Klamath County Sanitarian Many, Varied

The position of county sanitarian came into being in 1939 through the cooperation of the Klamath county court, the Klamath county health department and the United States public health service. To date, there have been three sanitarians, the present one being Lloyd G. Seely.

The office of county sanitarian, although it is under the Oregon state merit system, is directly responsible to Dr. Peter H. Rozendal, head of the county health department and to the county health board, consisting of Vance Vaupel, Fred Peterson, Lee Holliday, Dr. Truax and Walter Zimmerman.

The duties of the sanitarian are many and varied, among them being the inspection of public water supplies of which there are 46 in Klamath county, collecting samples from these supplies at least once a month and keeping a record of the results of tests.

In dealing with private water supplies, surveys are made of such supplies in small towns and communities. Upon request, individual inspections are made and samples are taken. If the water does not come up to the accepted standards for purity, suggestions are then made to

the individual giving advice as to the means of purifying the supply.

Other semi-public supplies are checked regularly, i. e., schools, granges, tourist camps, service stations, roadside fountains, etc. A close check is kept on the public and private sewage disposal plants of the county. Investigations of private sewage matters are made on request and information is given regarding proper disposal methods.

Tourist and trailer camps, picnic parks, also industrial and agricultural camps are inspected as to source of water supply—how water supply is protected, sewage disposal, adequacy of toilet facilities, control of flies, and insects, also proper methods of garbage collection and disposal.

Swimming pools are inspected for general cleanliness, shower and toilet facilities, floor disinfection, footbath maintenance, cleanliness of suits and towels, also purity of water and chlorine control. At the present time, swimming pool inspections are also made in Jackson and Lake counties.

All nuisance complaints are received and investigated by the county sanitarian.

In Klamath Falls the sanitarian makes all restaurant inspections. Each restaurant is checked not less than once during each six months period.

Fremont Tops Roosevelt in Grade School Touch Tackle

Monday night's speedball Mills topped Riverside 12 to 7. Gene Carlson, Doug Barker and Jim Stegner made field goals and Vernon Skoog and Jim Demarakas made lesser points for the Mills squad. Tom Morgan made five points for Riverside and Lloyd Hartley made two.

Friday's touch-tackle schedule calls for a battle between Pelican and Fairview on the Roosevelt field at 4:30 p. m. Robinson and Peak will be officials.
