

### Army Opposes Check on Morals of Wayward Wives

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1 (AP)—The army today opposed suggestions that it check the morals of wayward wives of service men before granting them dependency allowances.

Brig. Gen. H. C. Gilbert, administrator of dependency benefits, asserted the whole system of dependency payments would bog down in administrative detail if the faithfulness of wives had to be determined. He appeared before the house military committee considering legislation to boost dependency allowances.

Rep. Shore (R-Mo.) charged

that "harlots are marrying these boys just so they'll get the money that goes to wives."

He said a hospital in his district was filled with venereal women, many of them drawing dependency allowances from men overseas.

General Gilbert said, however, it should not be the function of military or government agencies to check on the conduct of the wives. He told the committee that congressional consideration of the subject of wayward wives would have a bad effect on men already overseas.

### Wheeler Complains Of Democrats During Father Draft Talk

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1 (AP)—Senator Wheeler (D-Mont.) asserted in the senate today that some of his democratic colleagues apparently prefer to take fathers into the armed services rather than fill military quotas without them.

Beginning his last appeal for his bill to halt further induction of pre-Pearl Harbor fathers for the rest of the year, the Montana anti-administrationist complained bitterly of the absence of democratic senators from the chamber.

### Reconnaissance Plane Downs Zero Over Nauru Island

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1 (AP)—A single American plane, engaging five Japanese Zeros over enemy-held Nauru island, destroyed one enemy ship and probably shot down another, the navy reported today.

The navy gave no information on the reconnaissance plane itself, but it was assumed that it returned safely to its base from the mission over Nauru during the morning of September 27, South Pacific Time.
