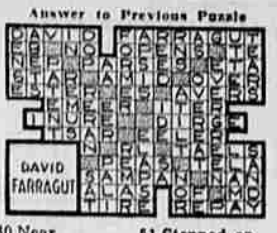
Whereas, the memory of those who have given their lives is honored by all and is an inspiration to us all in these war days, and

NEW JAIL PLAN TO BE HANDED FWA DIRECTOR

Preliminary plans and sketches for the proposed city-county jail will be presented to C. E. Stewart, regional director of the federal works agency, Portland, by Mayor John H. Houston, Police Judge Harold Franey and Architect Howard Perrin when they go to Portland this week. The three have an appointment with Stewart for Friday morning, Houston said.

Figures which will have a bearing on the case were being prepared by Franey Wednesday. The present city jail was constructed in 1914 and designed to handle the jail population of the city at that time. Since then facilities have been found inadequate and because of this fact, the city and county hope to receive Lanham Act funds to construct a new jail to serve both the city and county. Proposed site is at Third and Klamath near the present county plant.
