

# Humble Gets Both Nominations; Vote Canvass Finished

Clarence Humble defeated U. S. Balentine, 148 to 108, to win democratic as well as republican nomination for district attorney in the May 19 primary. It is shown in the final vote canvass completed at the county clerk's office today. The democratic nomination was by writing-in only on district attorney. Humble defeated Balentine 1634 to 1169 for the republican nomination, and, writing an independent candidacy, is assured of election as new district attorney.

Sheriff Lloyd Low, republican, who ran without opposition for sheriff party, got 435 democratic write-in votes along with his 10 republican votes—the largest single vote received by any individual in the election here.
