

PRODUCTION OF LUMBER GOES UP

WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP)—Lumber production in the first quarter of this year amounted to 7,701,602,000 board feet, a 3 per cent increase over the output of January, February and March of last year, the war production board reported today.

The net increase resulted from a 22 per cent boost in western production. In the east there was a decrease of 8 per cent, while the south showed the heaviest regional decline, 15 per cent below the first quarter, 1943 output.

Southern production was disrupted by rains and floods, but elsewhere lumbering conditions were favorable.

Production by regions in March was estimated as follows: Northeastern, 151,633,000; Appalachian, 150,234,000; North Central, 47,588,000; south central, 67,456,000; lake states, 129,800,000; south, 85,083,000; prairie, 4,771,000; North Pacific, 876,238,000; South Pacific, 126,510,000; northern Rocky mountain, 71,661,000; southern Rocky mountain, 31,987,000.
