Cab Drivers At Portland Don't Want Pictures

PORTLAND, Ore., June 2 (P)—Taxicab service was halted in Portland today in the climax of a long-standing dispute over a city ordinance requiring drivers to file their photographs at police headquarters.

Cabs began disappearing from the streets about midnight, stranding citizens who depend upon taxis for transportation to suburbs not served by owl streetcars.

The tie-up occurred after Municipal Judge J. J. Quillan warned drivers they would be sentenced to jail terms if arrested a second time for driving without a 1944 permit. Most drivers, in protest against the photograph-filing ordinance, have not obtained permits; and
