

CONVENTION OF CHURCHES SLATED HERE

The state convention of Oregon Churches of God will be held in Klamath Falls June 8, 9, 10 and 11, in the Mills school auditorium. It was announced this week by M. A. Tomlinson, general overseer, and H. M. Biggers, state overseer.

Thursday's program will open with a song service at 8 p. m., with Roy D. Givens in charge, followed by a concert prayer for the convention, the women address, testimony service led by Eliza Stephens and a talk, "The Purpose and Importance of the State Conventions," by Grady R. Kent.

Sunrise service at 6:30 a. m. is scheduled to start the Friday services. Riley Rogers is in charge. A song service by Delvin Daugherty will precede the business meeting. The Church That Is Fulfilling Prophecy Moves On, will be given by Earl Metcalf, overseer of Idaho. Divine healing is scheduled for 11:20 a. m., directed by H. B. Moore of Arizona. Afternoon services starting at 1:30 o'clock will feature a message, "Feed My Sheep," by Danny Gregory.

Friday evening the song service will be led by Ruby Moodenbaugh with a message, "The Young People Will Master Every Problem," by Inez Biggers, and a second message by John A. Stubbs, overseer of California.

A second sunrise service at 6:30 a. m. will open the Saturday session with the Sunday school work stressed during the morning program. In the afternoon the messages will be, "Except They Labor in Vain That Build It," by Sidney Cooley, overseer of Washington, and "Sanctification and Its Effect," by Joe Webb.

The program will continue Saturday at 7:45 p. m., with Grady R. Kent speaking. Song service will be in charge of Bob Williams and Ruth Williams will direct the evening testimony.

The last day of the convention will open at 6:30 a. m. with the 9:45 a. m. message brought by Elizabeth Knapp, "Who Should Pay Tithes and Where to Pay Them," is the 1:50 p. m. message by John A. Stubbs; "The Church of God Flag," Bob Williams, and "Baptism With the Holy Ghost," by W. L. Stephens. In the evening, starting at 7:45 o'clock, John A. Stubbs will conduct singing, the prayer will be led by Joe Webb and the evangelistic message by Grady R. Kent.

Writer Sees Battle Royal Rage From Plane Cockpit

A MARAUDER BASE IN ENGLAND, June 6 (AP)—From the cockpit of one of many hundreds of planes which supported the allied landing in northern France early on June 6, I watched a battle royal rage on the sea and in the air.

The fields along the French channel coast were dotted with parachutes of allied airborne forces who had landed a few minutes before and interspersed among the parachutes were aircraft—probably gliders.

The first signs of battle were flashed from the channel below, which through the mist and a naval smoke screen gradually became distinguishable as gun detonations on warships shelling the coast.

The channel wasn't "jammed

with shipping" as might have been expected. The channel is a big place, but on every hand there were forces of ships either battering the coast line or bringing up forces to take advantage of breaches.

The aircraft dotting the fields bore the distinctive allied invasion black and white zebra stripe, which was hurriedly slapped on the aircraft late yesterday.

(A broadcast from supreme headquarters said the black and white identifying stripes on the planes were one step toward preventing confusion and repetition of such mistakes as allied gunners firing on friendly planes, as happened in Sicily.)

United Nations convoys are bringing up additional reinforcements to support this initial invasion drive, and thousands of allied planes are hammering the coast.

General Demoted for Talk About Date of Invasion

SUPREME HEADQUARTERS, ALLIED EXPEDITIONARY FORCE, June 7 (AP)—One of America's best known major generals was demoted to lieutenant colonel and sent home for indicating in advance the time of D-Day.

The supreme command allowed this information to be cabled abroad today after holding it up several weeks for security reasons.

Supreme headquarters would not permit the officer's name to be cabled. He was one of the

commanders of the U. S. air force. An army man of long standing, he swiftly felt the supreme command axe after talking indiscreetly at a London cocktail party.

The conversation was said to have taken place almost two months ago when the invasion was expected almost daily. The general was reported to have said in the presence of several persons: "On my honor the invasion will take place before June 15."

His action was reported to security police by a woman guest and Gen. Eisenhower immediately ordered him reduced to the permanent rank of lieutenant colonel and sent home after an investigation.

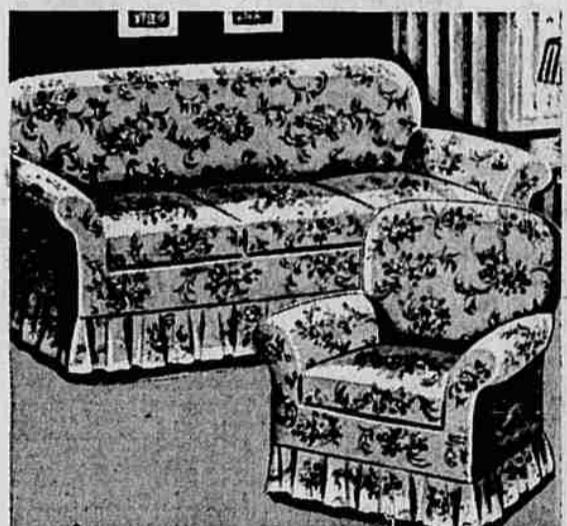
Newspapers Cut Advertising to Carry Invasion

LONDON, June 7 (AP)—The London Daily Express and Daily Telegraph both omitted all advertisements from morning editions today in order to give full space to invasion coverage.

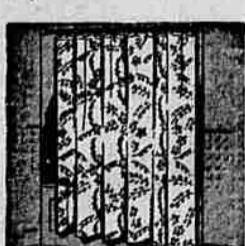
(The New York Daily Mirror and Daily News carried no advertising in their Wednesday morning editions, explaining they wanted to give full coverage to invasion news.)

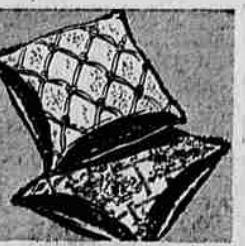

PORTLAND, Ore., June 7 (AP)—The invasion backfired along the

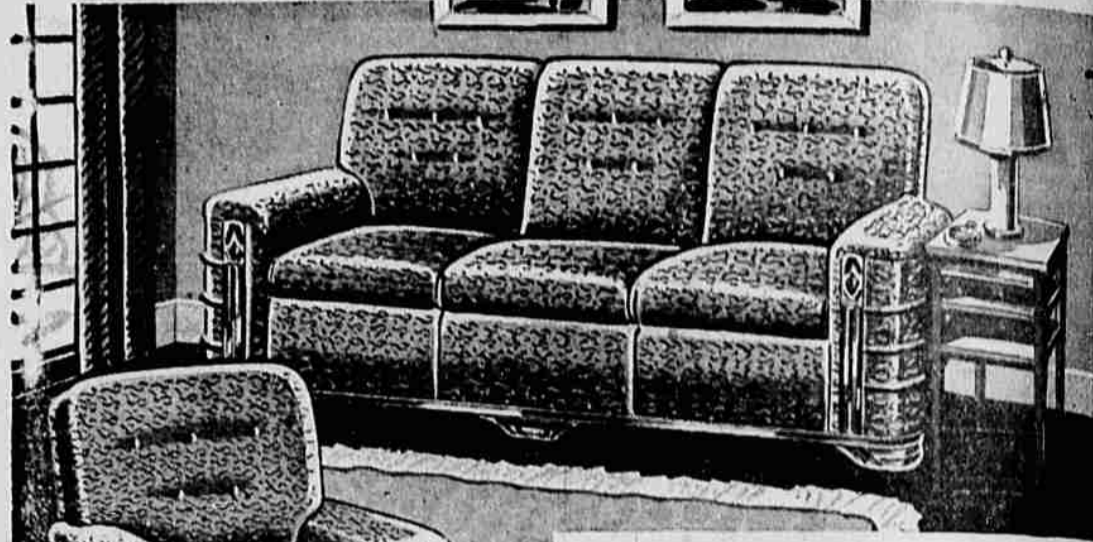
home front here today, with increasing numbers of war workers preparing to pack up and leave for peacetime jobs.
