

TROOPS DROP FROM GLIDERS DESPITE FLAK

By HOWARD COWAN A NINTH AIRFORCE TROOP-CARRIER BASE, June 8 (AP) — The troop-carrier command did its job. Its men went into France at little better than 100 miles an hour unarmed and unarmored and within bow and arrow range of German machinegun and flak emplacements.

They delivered an army with weapons and supplies behind Hitler's Atlantic wall. Take the case of Lts. Theron Anglemayr of Dodgeville, Wis., and Jeffrey Harrison of Cantonville, Miss. Clouds obscured the area where they were supposed to let the troops drop and they missed it.

On the Nose They circled and headed back into withering fire. This time they placed the paratroops right on the button. The Joes they fly are amazing—hard bitten, unfeared men whose trench is the sky.

One paratrooper riding in a C-47 shouted "Let me at them," tore loose from the crew who tried to restrain him and jumped with his machinegun. Not Talkative They found a jagged bullet hole in the bucket where he had been sitting. Nobody knows his name. He wasn't much for talk.

A tow rope broke while one group was forming up over a base and one glider had to land in a pasture several miles away while the rest of the outfit went on to France. "When they went to pick them up in a jeep, the profanity was something terrible," said Capt. Frank Coffey, Lincoln, Neb., tow ship pilot. "The paratroops had filed out and were stopping around giving us hell. Blankety blank blanks of blanks, they can't even get us where we are going," one said.

The paratrooper doesn't use blanks in conversation anymore than he does in a tommygun. Goebbels Claims Germans Knew "Second Front" Date

NEW YORK, June 8 (AP) — Nazi Germany professed to know the exact moment and place the allied armies would strike in their invasion of the "Fortress of Europe." So said diminutive, venom-tongued Doctor Paul Joseph Goebbels, reich's minister for propaganda and "president" of the most bombed city of Berlin.

Furthermore, he declared, Deutschland not only was confident of repelling the assault, but now was in a position herself to take the offensive. He made these statements in a recent speech, radiocast on a nationwide hookup. Goebbels did not elaborate on the reich's "offensive" plans, but indicated that England would bear the brunt of German fury.
