JUNCTION CITY, Ore., June 8 (AP)—Sparks from a burning slash pile started a blaze which destroyed the Arthur Gavalle and Sons sawmill, five miles west of here last night, with an estimated loss of \$25,000, mill officials said.

Volunteers joined the city fire department in preventing the fire from spreading to other equipment and lumber piles. About \$1000 worth of lumber and a truck in the mill also were destroyed. The mill employed 25 men and turned out 25,000-30,000 board feet of lumber a day.
