Game Bird Rules For Klamath Told

The Oregon state game commission has tentatively formulated the pheasant and quail regulations for the 1944 season. The final order will not be adopted until another meeting is held on June 24.

The season in Klamath county for pheasants and California or valley quail is from October 14 to October 29 inclusive. Bag limit for pheasant is four cocks per day or eight in possession. Ten day or in possession at any one time is the limit for quail.
