House Gets New Try At Crop Insurance

WASHINGTON, June 20 (AP) — Crop insurance, a subject that has embroiled congress several times in the past, was dropped into the house's lap again today for a new try. The rules committee reported out a bill by Chairman Fulmer (D-SC) of the agriculture committee reviving the system outlawed a year ago, after opponents declared the federal government steadily lost money, on the proposition.

Canadian Grain Duties Resumed

WASHINGTON, June 20 (AP) — Customs collectors were authorized today to resume collection of duties on Canadian grain and grain products imported for feed purposes. The suspension of duties ordered by congress last December and renewed in March expired last midnight. Congress has taken no action on a proposal to renew the suspension for 90 days. If a new suspension order is made retroactive, customs paid in the interim will be refunded.
