

# AFL CONFAB EYES PROBLEM OF POLITICS

EUGENE, June 22 (AP)—The controversial issue of endorsing political candidates confronted American Federation of Labor state convention delegates today.

They were faced with a choice of adopting resolutions endorsing a fourth term for President Roosevelt and the candidacy of Willis Mahoney, democratic nominee for U. S. senator, or on establishing a non-partisan political policy.

The latter was introduced by S. Eugene Allen, editor of the Oregon Labor Press and chairman of the laws and legislation committee. He declared that endorsement by the convention would lead to "disunity and confusion."

A death struggle between labor and management can result only in fascism, Dr. George Bernard Noble, 12th regional war labor board chairman, told the AFL delegates last night.

He urged labor to clean its own house and support harmonious bargaining in the public interest. Because of good labor conditions in the northwest, he said, labor cannot expect much higher wage increases unless living costs advance.

Speaking for the American Legion, W. M. Tugman, Eugene newspaper publisher, said the greatest tragedy that could befall America would be for soldiers to come home resentful of labor.

David Simpson, Portland chamber of commerce president, said "It is up to business and labor to work together for their common state in the post-war world."

Paul Raver, Bonneville power administrator, asserted that dams do not destroy private enterprise, they encourage it by providing cheap power.

The convention adopted a legislation committee report yesterday opposing a state sales tax and government regulation of labor, industry and agriculture.

"The problem is not how to prevent bureaucratic control of American labor, industry and agriculture and a large degree of state socialism," the report said, "but how to get rid of it."

American management and the AFL, said the report, can achieve results superior to those of "a multitude of overlapping agencies and impractical people."

The report labeled unsound the initiative measure for a sales tax to finance increased old-age benefits, and urged defeat of a measure that would shift support of local schools from property to income tax sources.

Entomologist Rosenstiel, representative of the U. S. public health service, has set up a mosquito check-up program in the Klamath area.

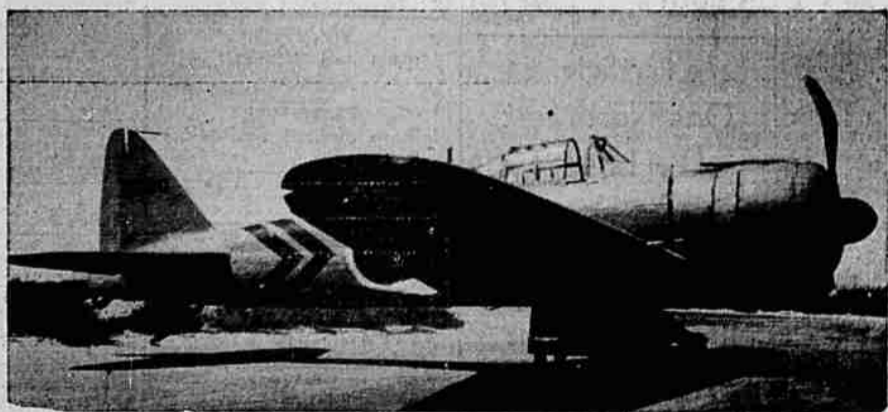
Rosenstiel was here last week for a preliminary survey, and indicated that while he felt no concern over the mosquito problem here, a checking project would be established as a precautionary measure.
