

BRICKER TO BE CONSIDERED BY GOP

CHICAGO, June 22 (AP)—Gov. W. Bricker of Ohio asserted today at a press conference that he would not withdraw his name from consideration for the republican presidential nomination. He added he did not expect to be offered the vice presidential place on the ticket. The Ohio governor, who arrived with a fanfare of a band playing the strains of "Beautiful Ohio," met the press in a conference preceding his appearance tomorrow before the convention's resolutions committee when he will report as chairman of a post-war advisory group on domestic issues.

The gray-haired governor, looking a smile, told reporters he intended to keep his name before the convention despite reports that Governor Thomas E. Dewey of New York has a long lead in delegate support.

"I will not withdraw because my name will be presented to the convention," Bricker said. "Certainly I cannot see any sense to myself or to the party in withdrawing."

The Ohio governor was asked if failing to obtain the presidential nomination, he would accept second place on the ticket. "That's something I'll never have to pass upon," Bricker said. "I am quite confident the vice presidential nomination never will be offered to me."

DR. SCOTT MOVING TO LAGUNA BEACH

Dr. S. F. Scott, for several years a practicing chiropractor at Klamath Falls, has retired from activity here and is moving to Laguna Beach, Calif.

At the California city, Dr. Scott has acquired a home and will enter the real estate business. He came here from the Willamette valley and has had offices in the Medical-Dental building.

Dr. and Mrs. Scott plan to sell their home here at 7th and Washington.

In a letter to The Herald and News, Dr. Scott said:

"I am appealing to you to help me let the wonderful people of Klamath Falls know how very much I appreciate their kindnesses to Mrs. Scott and myself. I shall be back for visits and hunting and fishing, and if any of my friends visit Laguna and fail to look me up, I will declare war on them."

Director Warns Against Optimism

WASHINGTON, June 22 (AP)—With bond sales to individuals in the Fifth War Loan at 18 percent of quota, War Finance Director R. Gamble warned the nation today against overconfidence in the drive.

"The tremendous surge of sales that some people expected as an immediate result of the invasion has not happened," he said in a letter to state war finance chairmen calling for "intensified sales effort."

Individual purchases totalled \$1,081,000,000 through Tuesday, eighth day of the drive. The quota for such sales is \$6,000,000,000 of the over-all goal of \$16,000,000,000.

considerable contribution to the success of the red army was made by our allies, the United States of America and Great Britain, who supplied us with very valuable strategic raw materials and subjected Germany's military objectives to systematic bombing, and thereby undermined Germany's military might.

The bureau asserted the Germans had lost 70,000 tanks, 60,000 airplanes and more than 90,000 pieces of artillery, as against Russian losses of 49,000 tanks, 30,128 airplanes and 48,000 guns.

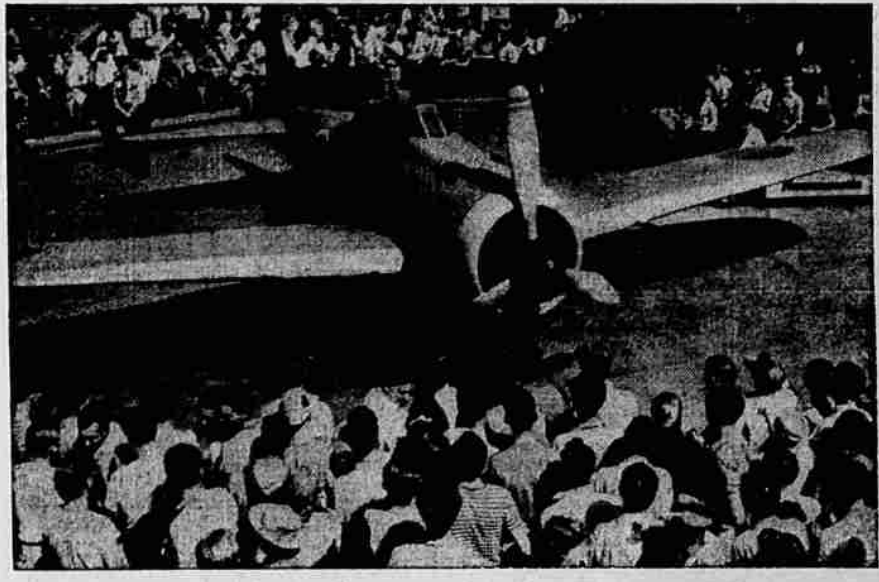
