### Service Station Men Stationed

PORTLAND, Ore., June 22 (AP)—Operators of two service stations here and one in Vancouver, Wash., have been suspended from selling gasoline for the duration, Sol Stern, district OPA mileage enforcement attorney, announced today. Stern said the Portland operator, J. F. Durr, admitted a shortage of 1479 gallons out of a total capacity of 1650 gallons, the Vancouver operator, J. C. Hale, admitted shortage of 1185 gallons from an inventory of 1700 gallons, and selling gas to friends without requiring coupons, Stern said. Both stations now are under new management, Stern added.

PORTLAND, Ore., June 22 (AP)—Congressional approval of more than \$10,000,000 in appropriations for the Bonneville power administration was announced
