

# Bond Buyers To See Premiere Of "Eve Of St. Mark"

## BIG SHOW SET FOR PELICAN ON WEDNESDAY

A major Fifth War Loan specialty here is the forthcoming premiere showing of the 20th Century Fox picture, "The Eve of St. Mark," at the Pelican theatre Wednesday night of the coming week.

Tickets obtained through purchase of war bonds will be the admission for attendance at this outstanding program, and no seats will be for sale in any other way.

A 20-minute local prologue has been arranged by the Fifth War Loan specialty committee.

Tickets may be obtained on any war bond purchase between June 17 and June 28. The bond, or proof of bond purchase, may be taken to the Pelican bond booth or the bond headquarters on Main street, and the ticket will be issued. Loge seats go to \$1000 bond purchasers.

"The Eve of St. Mark" is the love story of a soldier, written by Maxwell Anderson. As a play, it had a record run on Broadway. The stars in the film are Anne Baxter, William Eythe and Michael O'Shea, and John M. Stahl directed the production.

The Fifth War Loan committee stated it hoped to see the Pelican filled with bond buyers Wednesday night, and urged purchasers within the required dates to obtain show tickets. Payroll deduction bond purchases count on these tickets.

He said the state board of agriculture, at its session here his week, carefully considered every angle of the question and reached the conclusion that it was not justified in authorizing a fair under present conditions.

## Minority Observes 35 M.P.H. Limit

SALEM, June 24 (AP)—Eight per cent of the drivers on Oregon highways held their speeds below the 35-mile wartime limit during May while a majority drove 49 miles per hour or

less, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell Jr., said today. The 49-mile speed limit was compared with 51 which was the speed of the majority in April, 50 in March and February, and 51 in January, but Farrell urged still closer observation of the wartime 35 mph limit to conserve gasoline and tires.
