# German Flying Bombs Kill 2752; Injure 8000 in England, Says Churchill

LONDON, July 6 (AP)—German flying bombs have killed 2752 persons and wounded 8000 others since blind robot attacks, centered on London, started three weeks ago, Prime Minister Churchill disclosed to the house of commons today.

More than 10,000 of the casualties were in London, Churchill said, announcing that children already were being sent from the capital as they were in the blitz days four years ago. As the prime minister gave a grim accounting for the first time of the effect of Hitler's new weapon, the RAF again smashed at launching bases on the French coast whence 2750 of the robot bombs have been discharged on England in the past three weeks, Churchill said that "so far" about 50,000 tons of allied bombs have been dropped on these targets.

**Heavier Than Invasion**  
More Britons have been killed by flying bombs in southern England than were killed in the first 15 days of the battle of Normandy, Churchill disclosed.

Although putting London on a blitz basis, with casualty lists to be announced monthly, Churchill served notice that military operations in France came first.

"I do not want there to be any misunderstanding about it,"

he said. "We shall not allow the battle operations in Normandy or the attacks we are making against special targets in Germany to suffer."

**Demand Vengeance**  
To a commons that had been demanding vengeance for robot warfare on civilians and had been uneasy over the government's secrecy, Churchill said this was his answer to "What are you going to do about it?"

"Everything in human power, and we have never failed yet," he did not describe the "various methods" being used against the winged bombs, other than air attacks, but he disclosed that a special committee with "a great number of scientists and engineers" at its disposal had been set up to advise on "offensive and defensive" methods of dealing with the bombs. The committee reports to Churchill personally.

**Rejects Request**  
Churchill rejected a request for a secret discussion saying he thought that would give the impression he had "not been frank."

Deep shelters hitherto regarded as a reserve now will be brought into use, Churchill said, adding that Home Secretary Morrison ought to be congratulated "on having these up his sleeve."

## Flatboat Trip Reveals Dam Sites

PORTLAND, Ore., July 6 (AP)—A spectacular 260-mile trip by flatboat down the tortuous Salmon river in Idaho resulted in discovery of several possible dam sites, eight Portland engineers said today after their return here.

Headed by O. L. Hoffman, engineer in the Portland office of L. Col. Theron Bean, chief of U. S. engineers, the party charted the sites, to be surveyed later this summer.

The 12-day trip through the near-inaccessible country was made in a 30-foot boat which shot through some of the rapids at 30 miles an hour. The engineers wore life preservers continuously through the day, and curled up in sleeping bags on the boat or sandbars at night.

## Barrack Purchase Bids Called For

PORTLAND, July 6 (AP)—Bids for the purchase of the 10-building Manzanita barracks at Man-

zanita, Ore., will be opened by the army engineers on July 17. The buildings, declared surplus property by the war department, must be removed by the purchasers within 30 days of the contract award. They were constructed in 1943 on privately owned land leased to the government.

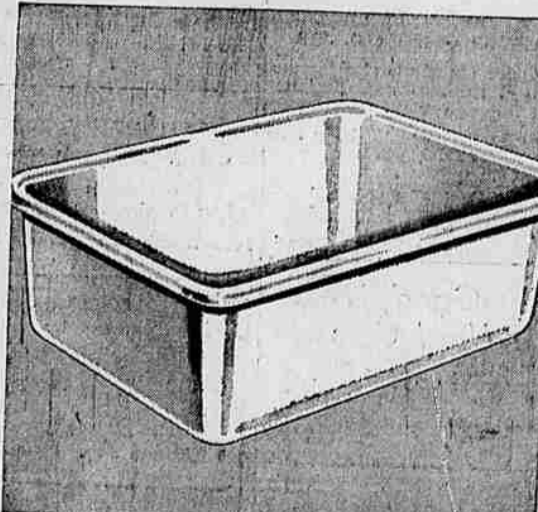

# Is Jesus the Son of God?

THE question asked in the title of this paper is one that you will answer at once in the affirmative. There are many who will deny this fact, yet there are many truths upon which our faith in the Sonship of Jesus must rest. If He is the Son of God, He is everything He claimed to be, nothing more and nothing less. The testimony of Himself and the testimony of the scriptures can be accepted only on the basis that He is everything that He claimed to be. He is the center of all Bible truth and apart from the fact that He is the Son of God the entire Bible can be rejected.

One of the fundamental characteristics of the Sonship of Jesus is His virgin birth. To deny this fundamental truth will wreck our faith in Christ, and destroy the usefulness of the scriptures as a witness against the attacks of the infidel. It is not alarming when the agnostic denies the virgin birth of Jesus, because if he can destroy this one great fundamental fact, he has undermined the whole system of faith in God. This is expected of him. However when so-called professors of theology reject this truth, it is time for not only alarm but chagrin also. One who denies the virgin birth of Jesus is not just a modernist, he is an infidel. To substantiate the foregoing statement I offer the following from the pen of inspiration in Luke 1: 26-35.

"Now in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God unto a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And he came unto her, and said, Hail, thou that art highly favored, the Lord is with thee. But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and cast in her mind what manner of salutation this might be. And the angel said unto her, Fear not Mary; for thou hast found favor with God. And behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God shall give him the throne of his father David; and he shall reign over the house of Jacob forever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know not a man? And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Spirit shall come upon thee, and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee; and therefore also the Holy thing which is begotten shall be called the Son of God." No logic, interpretation, or explanation need be added to this inspired text to prove the virgin birth of Jesus.

Another fundamental fact necessary to a substantial faith in the Sonship of Jesus is His resurrection from the dead. To deny that He arose from the dead makes the Christian life a meaningless duration of trials without a ray of hope. To teach that Jesus just "swooned away" and did not actually die is the rankest sort of infidelity. "And the angel answered and said unto the women, Fear not yet; for I know that ye seek Jesus, who hath been crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, even as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly and tell His disciples. He is risen from the dead—". (Matthew 28: 5-7).
