keep the munitions-production factory out of full operation. It is presumed that at least in the initial attack on Yawata the American bombardiers gave particular attention to hitting the steel-making plants at the steel mill. The coke units, chiefly of the construction, are easily damaged by bomb concussion. Without coke, the steel mills themselves cannot function.

Home Base

Sasebo is one of the four main bases of the Japanese in the Pacific. The others are Yokosuka, Sasebo, and Matsuyama on the main island, Honshu. The base includes one of the most productive shipbuilding yards at the coast of the navy, turning out large proportion of its submarine destroyers and other small-warcraft.

Since the outbreak of the war in China in 1937 Sasebo probably has been the busiest of all Japanese bases, since most of the warcraft used in China was built and repaired there.

reported no indication that the Germans were abandoning their long-contested eastern pivot. It was believed the Germans were holding only parts of the town as strong-points as the result of severe bombings.

Although all but one escape bridge from Caen, a pontoon bridge across the Orne river, had been destroyed, Roger D. Greene, Associated Press war correspondent, said the Germans still were strongly entrenched at Caen.

Artillery Barrage

The new American thrust was toward the west in the St. Jean De Daye area eight miles north of the highway center of St. Lo. It got underway behind a shattering artillery barrage arching the Vire river.

A field dispatch said the doughboys waded across the stream in the half-light of dawn, established a bridgehead in low marshy country, and then hit the enemy on the flank.

U. S. PLANES BLAST PLANTS IN GERMANY

LONDON, July 7 (AP)—Around 2000 U. S. planes attacked seven plane and oil plants near Leipzig in central Germany today, destroying 75 or more Nazi fighters in the greatest aerial battle since D-Day, while another force from Italy flew clear across Czechoslovakia and bombed an oil plant 75 miles east of Breslau.

Up to 500 U. S. Italy-based bombers escorted by Lightning and Mustang fighters flew perhaps 600 miles over Yugoslavia, Austria and Czechoslovakia in reaching the oil target in German

Silesia at Odertal. A number of interceptors were destroyed. Coke plants as well as a factory producing synthetic oil for diesel engines were hit. Railyards and an airdrome at Zagreb in Yugoslavia also were targets.

night, after a struggle reminiscent of the bitter, bloody combat at Cassino several months ago.

Strike Back

From the west coast along a sector extending at least 30 miles inland, the enemy struck back at the Americans. At some points the Germans strove to infiltrate and break into newly-gained allied positions and were thrown back only after brisk engagements.

Also along this front enemy infantry and tanks were backed up by increasingly active German artillery, with long range 170-millimeter rifles sending big shells screaming over the lines in a harassing fire against fifth army supply routes. Six-barreled Nebelwerfers were used profusely against American armor.

East of Rosignano a equally strong resistance was encountered in the area of Castellina, at Colle di val d'Elsa and north of Montecatini. The greatest advance came when American tanks moved up three miles, capturing high ground northwest and northeast of Montecatini. Other Americans fighting alongside the French pushed through fierce opposition along highway No. 2 to a point three miles northeast of Colle di val d'Elsa.
