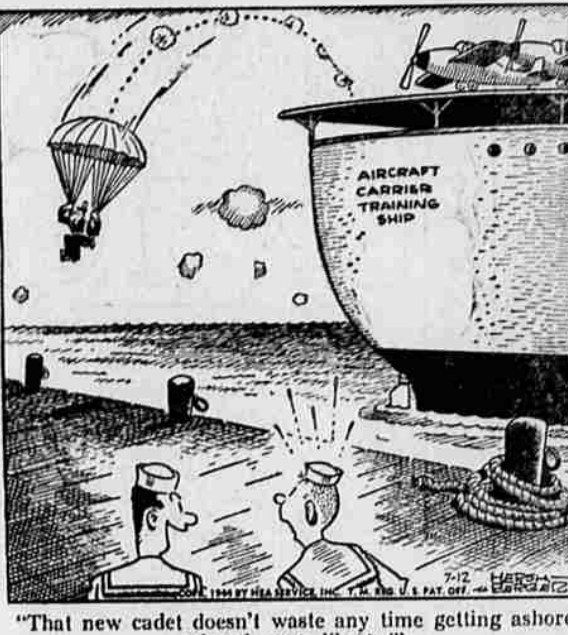
DAV Members Told To Interest Women In Nursing
