

FIRE SCHOOLS TO BE OPENED FOR FIGHTERS

A series of training schools for forest fire fighters is being conducted this week at forest protection camps in this area.

On Wednesday, a school was held at King's cabin, the KFFPA camp in the Yamsay country where a number of Klamath Union high school boys are stationed. The training was given at Penny Springs, a similar camp west of Klamath Falls, on Thursday, and on Friday the school will move to the blister rust camp on Jenny creek, where about 50 boys are located.

Lee Port, assistant state forester, and Ed Schroeder, of the state forest office, are in charge of the training work.

The fire-fighters are taught the progressive method of trail-making, with each man assigned a tool and a place in line which is held throughout a trail project. Safety measures are emphasized.

After the day's work at King's cabin, the state forestry men warmly praised the spirit and ability of the boys at that camp, and said they expected to find similar conditions in the other camps in this area.

Reconversion Program to Go Into Effect Saturday

WASHINGTON, July 13 (AP)—Donald M. Nelson's program for "reconversion in miniature," fought by the army and navy in one of Washington's most explosive inter-agency struggles, will go into partial effect Saturday and full effect August 15.

In a compromise announced last night the war production board chairman agreed to postponement until mid-August of the most important part of his program—an order which would permit manufacturers to make civilian goods now restricted or banned entirely, upon approval from WPB field offices.

This step, one of four orders which Nelson described as "industrial preparations for peace," will mean at the start a slight increase in civilian goods, through the use of plants and workers not needed in the war effort.

Ultimately, however, it is intended to provide the machinery for giving work to men and machines left idle by the deep cutbacks in arms production which will come when Germany falls.

The other three orders—all vital to industry but of less immediate concern to consumers—will appear at seven-day intervals starting Saturday with the lifting of curbs on the use of aluminum and magnesium.

The very existence of the robot bombs is enough to show the danger if the Germans were to be permitted to re-arm. Technically this weapon could be perfected, and with thousands of these bombs being fired a day the results might be other than those that can be achieved now.—Norwegian Ambassador Wilhelm Munthe de Morgensterne.

July 29—Permission to industry to start at once placing orders for machines, tools and equipment which will be needed in tooling up for peacetime pursuits.

August 15—Local, "spot" authorization.

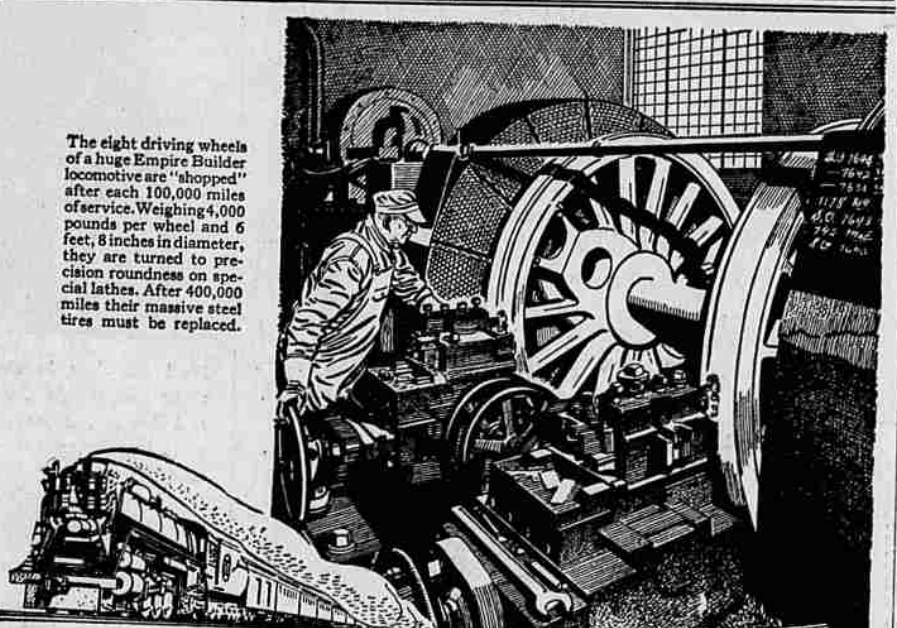

SMOKE SHORTAGE MAY CONTINUE

NEW YORK, July 13 (AP)—The shortage of popular brands of cigarettes probably will continue until the European war is ended, trade sources said today.

Named as factors in the continuing shortage were, in the order of their importance:

The expanding quantity of tax-free cigarettes sent overseas to increase military stockpiles. Brands popular here also lead in overseas demand.

The tight inventories of leaf tobacco stored in warehouses. These were described by the trade as "pretty thin" and the industry said it was unwilling to lower the amount of this aged tobacco which must go in cigarettes.

The increasing serious shortage of cases and containers. Industry sources explained the

war production board has limited the use of such cartons to about 80 per cent of 1942 requirements, despite the increase in demand.

ONE BODY

"THERE is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling." (Eph. 4:4). It is not an uncommon thing today for the question to be asked, of what church are you a member? No such questions were propounded in the apostolic age, because there was no such thing as denominationalism as we know it today. Paul said there is one body, and he affirmed that the body is the church. "For he is the head of the body, the church..." (Col. 1:18). "For as we have many members in one body, and all the members have not the same office, so we who are many are one body in Christ, and every one, members one of another." (Rom. 12:4, 5). In I Corinthians 12:20 we read, "but now are there many members, yet but one body." The church is the body, there is one body; there is but one body, therefore but one church over which Christ is the head.

Christ is not the head of many bodies, but of one body. He is not the head of many churches, but one church. That's not my logic, but the inspired truth spoken by the Apostle Paul. It is not enough that we be members of "a church," but in order to have fellowship with Christ, we must be members of His church.

There are a number of denominations who claim to be the church of the Lord, but not one of them can show by the Bible a divine right to exist, and to practice in religion the things they hold to be orthodox. Every denomination that exists today, is here by virtue of the authority of men, and though they teach many things which are written in God's Word, yet in their zeal to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves to the righteousness of God.

If all denominations would cease to teach and practice those things which are not taught in the word of God, and would all teach and practice the things commanded of the Lord, denominationalism would soon come to an end, and there would be but one body, and one great family of all the believers in Christ.
