Post-War Boom in Trade With Russia Predicted

WASHINGTON, July 14 (AP)—A tremendous postwar boom in trade with Russia is foreseen by Eric Johnston, president of the United States chamber of commerce. He began work today on plans to translate into dollars-and-cents orders the information he obtained on a lengthy tour of the soviet union.

Johnston outlined his Russian information at a press conference yesterday. Now his principal effort is to discover how he can translate his information into action. It is expected that he will confer in time with many government officials and business men.

Based on conversations he had with Marshal Stalin and other top soviet officials and also on personal observations made during thousands of miles of travel, Johnston said:

1. Russia is looking to this country for an imagination-staggering supply of mining and industrial machinery, railway and hydro-electric equipment, ships, trucks and road building tools and machines. She needs these things to rebuild wrecked plants and to expand productive capacity.

2. In order to buy from the United States, it is "absolutely essential" that Russia have long term credits (10 to 30 years). Also, the United States must buy from Russia, taking raw materials such as manganese, nickel and other steel alloys, timber and the like; that will enable the Russians to pay off their loans.

3. Russia's aim in rebuilding is to achieve a high standard of living. The government and the people would like to reach the standard of this country. Therefore, Johnston does not believe Russia will be a serious competitor for international trade "in the foreseeable future."
