Pledged to Vice President Henry A. Wallace: Iowa, 20; Minnesota, 24; Oregon, 14; Washington, 18, Total, 76.

Claimed for Wallace: California, 27 (out of 52); Colorado, 12; Delaware, 8; Florida, 18; Georgia, 26; Michigan, 38; Montana, 10; Pennsylvania, 72; Wisconsin, 26; District of Columbia, 6. Total, 243.

Grand total of pledged and claimed votes for Wallace, 319. Needed for nomination, 589.

Pledged to James F. Byrnes of South Carolina, Mississippi, 20.
