POSTWAR EXPANSION PREDICTED IN STATE

PORTLAND, Ore., July 19 (AP)—The president of the Los Angeles board of harbor commissioners predicted today that Oregon and Washington's postwar expansion will exceed his own home state of California.

Eugene Overton, who is presiding over the annual conference of the Pacific Coast association of port authorities, opening here today, cited lumber and wheat as highly important northwest products for rehabilitation of the Orient.

Eastern businessmen, he told interviewers, "have shown more interest in the Pacific northwest than in California because of your power development and your proximity to the Orient. Middle western manufacturers expect to ship their goods through here, and some will establish industries here."

Delegates from the three Pacific coast states and British Columbia registered this morning for the three-day conference of port authorities. Meetings open this afternoon.

MEXICAN INDUSTRIAL LABOR AUTHORIZED

CORVALLIS, July 19 (AP)—Employment of 600 Mexican farmhands in industry during the mid-summer slack season was authorized today by the war food administration and the war manpower commission.

J. R. Beck, state supervisor of emergency farm labor, said the imported workers would not be needed on farms from the completion of the canning pea and cherry harvests until the fall harvest opens around August 20.

The Mexicans may be employed in forestry, food processing, grain warehouses and similar industrial jobs closely connected with agriculture, Beck said.

A total of 3700 Mexicans are now employed in the state, and an additional group of 900 are expected for the farm peak labor period, August 20-October 10.

BYRNES REQUESTS NAME WITHDRAWAL

CHICAGO, July 19 (AP)—War Mobilization Director James Byrnes wrote Senator Burnet Maybank today asking that his name not be placed before the convention as a candidate for vice president.

His letter said: "In deference to the wishes of the president, I ask that my name not be placed before the convention as a candidate for the democratic nomination for vice president."

"The action of the (South Carolina) delegation in declaring its support for me for this honor and in insisting that my name go before the convention is deeply appreciated by me.
