## BIG LAKES COMPANY FINDS LARGE LOGS

Big Lakes Box company is finding a lot of big logs in its operations in the Sand Ridge district, near the east entrance of Crater Lake National park.

Logging Superintendent Harry Messner said that the average is 24 16-foot logs to the thousand feet.

This is national forest timber. The logs are loaded at Chinchallo, on the Southern Pacific main line, at the rate of about 250,000 feet a day. They are then railed to the Klamath Falls mill.

Lamm Lumber company is logging in the same area and the two companies have separate spurs at Chinchallo.
